Date: 7/6/14

Topic: Child Welfare

Issues: We started the conversation by talking about how the foster care system works in the state of Nevada. We talked about how many kids were in the system and what kind of person it takes emotionally to become a foster parent. We talked about what happens to the kids when they age out of the system and how many actually get adopted. We talked about the stigma of being a foster kid and how they community can help with support groups and charities that help the kids. We talked about the rules and regulations for the foster families and what happens when a parent returns to the picture. We talked about how many kids can be in a foster family and how the family is compensated from the state. We also discussed age restrictions and how the state does inspections.

Topic: Environment & Tourism

Issues: We discussed the balance of taking care of the environment and the wildlife of Nevada and the effect it has on tourism. Hunters bring in a lot of money to the economy. If Nevada Herds are not managed properly we could lose that part of our financial future. We talked about how the wildfires affect the herds and the lack of water the plants and bird migration. We also discussed the Bear hunt and the black bears in the region. We discussed the problem of garbage hunting bears and people living in bear country who do not take the proper precautions leading to the euthanization of the bears. We also talked about the ongoing conflict with ranchers and wild horses. How wild horses could be used for tourism. We talked about all of the ways people can find information about fishing and hunting in Nevada. We also discussed keeping our water ways clean and clear and how fishermen help with the ecosystem.

Topic: Water quality and safety

Issues: We talked about the latest water quality report and the results for the area. We discussed the process the water from the Truckee River goes through to become our drinking water. We talked about the current state of drought in Nevada and how important it is to conserve water at this time. We talked about all the different ways to conserve inside and outside of the home. We talked about the services that TMWA provides and the differences between TMWA and other agencies. We talked about their web site and how customers can use it to its fullest by learning to conserve and by making suggestions and asking questions of the professionals. We talked about storm drains and how putting things and chemicals down them can affect the drinking water. We also talked about flushing expired prescriptions down the drain.

Topic: Rehabilitation

Issues: We talked about the need for second chances in society and how the Ridge house helps men and women who are released from prison. Many Programs Provided. Everything from parenting classes to financial education. The Ridge house works with employers to help people find jobs that will help them reenter society and grow. Not typical fast food jobs but jobs they can build careers on. They offer peer to peer counseling and a home until they can get settled on their own. The counselors and house managers have all been through the programs that are provided because they are former inmates themselves. It's about letting the residents know they are not alone and that they have walked in their shoes. The administration goes into the prison system to find the inmates who are truly in need of change and who have the best chance at success. They are run on private donations and grants. They don't use volunteers in the houses so they can make sure everyone is safe and getting the proper counseling.

Topic: Public Safety

Issues: We talked about the programs that are being expanded and currently running due to a grant from the Dept of Public Safety. Speeding and dangerous intersection patrol. DUI task force and Pedestrian safety. With many pedestrian deaths through the year, the Sheriff's office wants to educate as many as possible about using crosswalks. Trying to educate both drivers and pedestrians. We also talked about changing the attitudes of kids walking to school. We also discussed what the Sheriff's office is doing to connect with the community. More is being put out on their website and citizens can sign up for a weekly news letter. They are also expanding their citizens emergency training classes to make sure the community is prepared in case of emergency and can help the department. We talked about what type of commitment it takes to volunteer for the Sheriff's office, whether it is in the office or on the search and rescue team.

Topic: Animal Welfare

Issues: We talked about the ongoing negotiations with the county and the state regarding TNR, Trap-Neuter-Release. It's a feral cat program that according to them saves the county and tax payers hundreds of thousands of dollars. At issue is in the wording of county and state ordinances regarding animal abandonment. We talked about the need to re-word the ordinance so TNR can continue. If not thousands of cats would be put to death at the Washoe County Regional Animal Control Center. We talked about the need to end the feral cat problem by neutering and not by removing and killing animals. We also discussed making Northern Nevada a no kill community. We talked about funding, volunteering & Fostering and the need for people to be part of animal control ordinances and legislation. We also discussed how being an

animal friendly community has not only been recognized nationally but has also added to the economy locally.
