The organization operates clubs in 21 locations for children and teens from kindergarten to high school. Porteous explains the learning areas the programming addresses as well as mental health resources provided to kids and teens. She also gives examples of the impact these services make on the kids in the program. Other topics include information on how families can get their child involved and the importance of volunteers.</p>

Teens & Human Trafficking	Closer Look	Oct 9	7:00 pm	15 minutes	<p>Help for Runaway Teens, Free Bus Tickets To Safety</p> <p>Teenagers are especially vulnerable to the evils of modern slavery. “Human trafficking is a legitimate concern for folks out the street,” says Jeff Stern, CEO of the National Runaway Safeline. More than 4-million teenagers are homeless every year, though not always by choice. “Whether it’s that they don’t feel safe in their own home, or whether they’ve been kicked out, this is not something young people generally want.” Whatever drove them to the streets, hunger inevitably awaits. Traffickers spot runaways as easy prey and sometimes offer food to bait the trap.</p>

Our goal is to have StandUpGirl show up on that <i>first page</i> of their google search.”</p>

Matthew Belwood knows how that feels. At 16, Matt lost most of hearing and now, as the National Director of Youth for Christ's Deaf Teen Quest, his heart is for young people to know their worth in Christ. Matt says growing up, his church youth group surrounded him with love, but when they explained his deafness to others, it felt like they were saying, "He's awesome, but he has something that may be a little bit broken inside of him...these great people that are really trying to help me and protect me and love me and cherish me in my youth group kind of planted the seed inside my head that ' he's amazing, except for one thing.'" Matt emphasizes that the deaf teen isn't broken, but part of the body of Christ with great potential. Often deaf teens feel disconnected and alone during a time when there are so many mental, emotional and spiritual changes going on. More than 80 percent of deaf and hard-of-hearing teens don't have a parent who can sign or communicate with them in a direct way. Matt says with Deaf Teen Quest, "caring Christian adults</p>

Often laced with fentanyl, these deadly drugs can be 100x stronger than morphine. "It's terrifying," says Pat Aussem of the Partnership to End Addiction. Ed Ternan, co-founder of Song for Charlie lost his college-aged son to one pill and now helps other parents warn their children. "We still say 'just say no' but we spell it K. N. O. W. because many of these young victims are dying from taking a substance they didn't ask for." Hook spent years counseling foster children as a mental health professional. “We’re not always looking at it from the adoptee’s side,” she warns, for example, repeatedly calling one’s adoption a ‘gift’ can unintentionally hurt your child. Vanessa Joy Walker is an author and lifecoach who was herself adopted as a baby. “The issues of identity and abandonment are interwoven into who I am, they are part of what I call my emotional DNA.” Billie Branham reports.</p>

Ginsberg describes their services including food assistance, clothing, personal hygiene services, access to primary healthcare, mental healthcare, employment assistance and case management to help people navigate the system to find affordable housing. He also describes their respite care service for people discharged from the hospital that don't have a safe and supportive place to recuperate. The National Weather Service has issued Blizzard Warnings for all Northeastern Colorado Counties and Winter Weather Advisories for several Southeastern Counties. Significant travel impacts, including road closures, are likely over the plains of Colorado.</p> <p>In fact, most of the major highways over Eastern Colorado are now closed, including stretches of I-70, I-76, US6, US385, US40, US287, US138, CO86,94 , 59, 42, 392, 71, 34, 36, 6, 113, 14,and 23.</p> <p>For the Denver area, we can expect to see 2 to 4 inches of snow but those in the west and east of the I-25 Corridor should expect to see between 4 to 6 inches snow. Road conditions over the mountains and the Denver, Springs and Ft., Collins areas will deteriorate as the day progresses.</p> <p>Please be safe, and if at all possible, you should likely just stay home today due to the inclement weather.</p>
