Episode Description:

#2101 Chesapeake Bay Visitors, Part 1

Acrylic Medium on 15x30 horizontal stretched canvas. In this first episode Jerry explains the ecological significance of the Chesapeake Bay being the largest estuary in the United States. Then he proceeds by showing how to paint the sky and block in the water. Then he shows how to block in the first value of very distant grasses. Then he finishes by discussing how to compose the grasses in the middle and foreground.

#2102 Chesapeake Bay Visitors, Part 2

In episode 2, Jerry shows his viewers how to add a hazy fog in the background. Then he shows how to block in all of the vertical grassy areas using the #6 or #10 synthetic chisel-edge brush. Then shows how to add the reflections and finishes by showing how to add the shoreline highlights and soften the reflections with a horizontal glazing technique.

#2103 Chesapeake Bay Visitors, Part 3

In episode 3, Jerry shows his viewers how to continue glazing the water to give it a more transparent affect.

Then he explains adding the warm, soft sienna tones to the grasses -- giving the painting more color harmony. He finishes this episode by painting in some of the intermediate weeds and explains the compositional arrangement of the Canadian Geese to create good eye-flow.

#2104 Chesapeake Bay Visitors, Part 4

In this final session, Jerry recaps the importance of creating good compositional eye-flow of the Canadian Geese. Then he shows how to properly under-paint the geese in the proper values and hues using the small sable and synthetic chisel-edge brushes. Now Jerry shows how to add the taller weeds using the chisel-edge brushes and the script brush. Then Jerry finishes up by detailing the geese and explaining how you can use your artistic license to finish up by adding your own unique touches.

#2105 A Colorful Gateway, Part 1

Acrylic Medium on 16x20 vertical stretched canvas. In the first episode, Jerry explains the purpose for using a gallery wrapped canvas. Then he discusses his reference material and how to use it to lay out the composition. Now Jerry shows how to use the #12 bristle brush to mottle in the suggested background of bushes/leaves. Then he shows how to under-paint the pathway and brick foundation. He finishes by explaining how to properly sketch in the picket fence using basic perspective techniques.

#2106 A Colorful Gateway, Part 2

In this episode, Jerry begins by adding another lighter value of scumbled leaves in the background. Then he shows how to under-paint the picket fence. Then shows how to create an elliptical affect of the stones on the pathway and then how to under-paint them. Next Jerry shows how to under-paint the bricks and paint in the large flower pot. He finishes by smudging in cast shadows and explaining things to come in the next episode.

#2107 A Colorful Gateway, Part 3

In this episode, Jerry begins by showing his viewers how to begin the intermediate values of background flowers and leaves. Then he continues with the process of adding miscellaneous intermediate highlights and details on the stone pathway, brick wall, and miscellaneous leaves and foreground grasses. Now he blocks in the foreground terracotta pots and adds the foliage in the pots. He finishes by explaining all of the details and things that will be added in the final session.

#2108 A Colorful Gateway, Part 4

In the final session Jerry begins by explaining the details he will be adding. Then he proceeds to show how to finish the fence pickets and horizontal cross-braces. Then he begins adding highlights on stone pathway and pots. Now he shows various ways to make different types of flowers and how to make them very bright by using thicker opaque paint. He finishes with the #4 script brush by adding tall weeds and limbs in the background.

#2109 A Frosty Tradition, Part 1

Acrylic Medium on 16x20 horizontal stretched canvas. In this first episode Jerry explains why the canvas is pre-tinted with a mauve-ish/blue-gray tint. Then shows how to mix and apply it. Then he explains the composition and uses soft vine charcoal to make a rough sketch of the land contours and basic objects. Now he shows how to paint a late evening sunset. Now he finishes by painting in the first layer of distant trees.

#2110 A Frosty Tradition, Part 2

In this first episode, Jerry re-sketches the farm house. Now he begins applying the second layer of snow highlights and shows how to highlight the pathway. Now he blocks in the farm house and pine trees that surround it. He now shows how to highlight the farm house and add miscellaneous details. Then he paints in the large pine tree on the left side to balance the composition.

#2111 A Frosty Tradition, Part 3

In this episode, Jerry begins by painting final highlights and details on the farm house. Then he begins adding the third layer of highlights on the snow drifts. Now he shows how to add the shadows of the snow on the pine trees and cast shadows on snow. Then he under-paints the clumps of grasses. Jerry finishes this session with a detailed explanation of how to sketch in the old mailbox, cream can, and snowman.

#2112 A Frosty Tradition, Part 4

In this session, Jerry shows his viewers how to properly under-paint the snowman using a scumbling/mottled technique. Then shows how to under-paint the mailbox post and cream can using the chisel-edge brushes. Then he shows how to drift-up the snow around the snowman to seat it. Then he finishes up by blocking in the straw hat and adds some intermediate details to the mailbox, cream can, and post.

#2113 A Frosty Tradition, Part 5

In the final episode of this series, Jerry takes his viewers through the process of painting in the final details and highlights. He shows how to paint the features on the snowman's face, buttons, scarf, and adds the branches for his hands. Then Jerry details the mailbox by adding the red flag. Now he dabs a little bit of fallen snow on different parts of the mailbox. Then he finishes by adding tall weeds and dead bushes with the #4 script brush. Then he puts a little more snow highlights on the pathway.
