Section I – Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. A New Hope For Men With Advanced Prostate Cancer. Roughly 800 to 1,000 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer every year in Genesee County. Treatments for metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancer have remained the same for seventy years until now. Scientists have created a medication, called Nubeqa, that pairs with the original treatments and helps lengthen the lifespan of patients.
- **B.** <u>Antibiotics Part 2: We Are What We Eat.</u> Farmers in and around Genesee County offer a safer way to eat with non-GMO farming as drug use within animal agriculture is at an all-time high.
- C. <u>How 'Long Covid' Has Brought Attention to a Neglected Illness.</u> Many residents in Genesee County are still suffering from "Long Covid." Myalgic encephalomyelitis/chronic fatigue syndrome has long been a condition surrounded by doubt in the medical community.
- **D.** Why Getting Stuck in a Crowd Is More Dangerous Than You Think. Crowd surges occur when too many people are packed into one place. Whether you're attending a large concert, protest, parade or any other major event in Genesee County, the result can be deadly if things get out of control.
- **Ending Overdose: Making the Antidote More Accessible Than The Drug:** An average of almost five people die every single day in the state of Michigan. Many of those victims are right here in Genesee County. A non-profit organization called End Overdose informs and arms the public with the tools needed to prevent and reverse opioid overdoses.
