Event: 2020/2021 WXJM Scholarship Program

Dates: September 2020 – April 2021

Organizer: Internal

Staff: Calvin Pynn (WXJM Advisor), and William Fawcett

Awarded 2 scholarships to James Madison University students involved with our student-station WXJM. These students will gain hands-on practical experience in broadcast management through their participation in the WXJM management team, and will be mentored by professional staff.

JMU also provides unpaid opportunities in radio broadcasting, production, promotion, sales and management to approximately 60 students per year at WXJM.

Event: 2020/2021 SMAD Scholarship Program

Dates: April, 2021

Awarded 13 scholarships to James Madison University students studying in the School of Media Arts and Design. These scholarships were awarded from established scholarship programs providing in excess of \$35,000 in support for students. Although many of the specific awards are broad in scope, the school has many graduates who have pursued broadcasting as a career. Several of the scholarships were journalism specific.

Student Interns - Operations (5)

This program is designed to give interns hands on experience in the processes involved with operating and working at a college radio station. The program will span the entirety of each JMU semester, with an expected time commitment of 4 hours per week. Interns will work 2 hours each week with the General Manager, and will complete the rest of their hours through weekly partnerships with second line teams or CD review. Second Line team support assignments (Database Management, Music Directors, Publicity/Media, Member Outreach and Education, WXJM Live, Events) will be based on personal interest and skills.
