Maui continues to deal with the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. As the third quarter concludes, Maui and the state as a whole prepares for the return of travelers on Oct. 15 under the state's pre-travel COVID-19 testing program. Several hotels have announced coordinated reopening and schools are preparing to shift to more in-person and hybrid models following Fall Break in October. There is still very high unemployment numbers, and an ongoing need for food distribution events and families continue to struggle.
