***Jay Sekulow Live*** – Monday – Friday at 1:00pm (25 minute duration)

Another benefit of the bill would be the creation of a page on the commissioner's website that would track the ongoing expenses related to cases currently under investigation.

She provides practical ways to help trafficked victims and gives you tools to effectively protect your children.
Politics/Government	1:00 pm – Legislative Update	06/02/17	5 Minutes	Jeff Lazloffy talks about the case of <i>Espinoza v. Montana Department of Revenue</i> , a two-year old court case. Senate Bill 410 was a bill to allow tax credits for donations to organizations that provide scholarships for students to attend private schools, including private religious schools. No state dollars are involved. It's simply a tax credit. After the bill was passed, the Department of Revenue stepped in and declared private religious schools to be ineligible. This is patent viewpoint discrimination, and our side threatened to sue. Over 1500 students drop out of Montana schools each year, and this bill will allow them to find a school that works for them. The decision also re-establishes the fact that government cannot discriminate against people based on their religious beliefs.
