Veterans who want to know if they qualify can reach out to their case worker at the VA hospital. Once WVRF receives the paperwork they usually have a 24-72 hour turnaround. Wounded Veterans pay the service providers directly. To help raise funds they are putting on their 10th Annual Treasure Coast Bonita Blast Fishing Tournament sponsored by RP Funding.
