ISSUE: NATIONAL POLITICS

Program: Perspectiva Nacional (Segment #1, 9:00)

When: January 7th, 2018 (Saturday 11:00pm/Sunday 6:00pm)

Description of Program

We analyze the political agenda for 2018. We talk about Steve Bannon's accusations against Donald Trump Jr., the continuing threats of a nuclear war between North Korea and the United States and government funding. Guests: Alfonso Aguilar, Republican analyst and Michael Werz of the Center for American Progress.
