Section I. Issues

This station has identified the following issues as significant ones that are facing our community in this quarter:

- A. ARTS, ENTERTAINMENT, AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS: The important summer cultural season is in full swing during this quarter. It is a critical component of the Berkshire economy, and important for the edification of our residents as well. We hope to explore these opportunities for our listeners on WTBR programming.
- B. **PITTSFIELD MUNICIPAL PRELIMINARY ELECTION:** Pittsfield holds a municipal election in 2023, which will include choosing a mayor, as incumbent Linda Tyer decides not to run for a third four-year term. There is a preliminary election on September 19th to narrow the field of candidates in three races: Mayor, and two city council wards.
- C. **OPIOID USE DISORDER & HARM REDUCTION**: Pittsfield and Berkshire County are in the midst of a crisis of overdose fatalities with use of opioids. Several initiatives, such as Healing Communities, Harm Reduction, and Narcan distribution are in operation. We explore the issue in depth on several programs.
- D. **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, TRANSPORTATION, AND PLANNING:** Small business is an important economic engine in Pittsfield and the Berkshires, as the area does not feature many large corporations as employers. We aim to spotlight small businesses making an effort to survive and thrive in the area, along with other general topics in this category.
- E. **EDUCATION:** Almost as soon as it begins, summer is over and the new school year ramps up. As always, there is discussion surrounding many issues in the education community, for students, parents, and educators at the elementary, secondary, and post-secondary levels here in Pittsfield and the Berkshires. Offerings at the local community college are an area we hope to spotlight with our coverage.
- F. LOCAL NEWS & POLITICS: Beyond the topic of the municipal election, there are important topics to explore with state and local elected officials, which could benefit listeners. The state budget process continues during the quarter, so we seek to learn more from our state representatives, as much of this information does not reach Berkshire County from Boston.
