Section I. Issues

This station has identified the following issues as significant ones that are facing our community in this quarter:

- A. LOCAL NEWS & POLITICS: Local issues that arose during this quarter included the city's response to an unexpectedly severe winter storm at the end of December; grant funding for Springside House; a proposed ballot initiative concerning traffic patterns and bike lanes on North Street; and many more. WTBR aired several programs featuring interviews with local officials to discuss these issues.
- B. **EDUCATION:** We address the upcoming transition of Taconic High School to an all-vocational school and explore the diverse offerings of our local community college, along with many other issues.
- C. **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, TRANSPORTATION, AND PLANNING:** Issues surrounding recent economic development initiatives; specific issues concerning black-owned businesses; and the state of our roads, bridges, and infrastructure are all issues that face our listeners. We address all of these with programming this quarter.
- D. **PUBLIC SAFETY & LAW ENFORCEMENT:** Substance Use Disorder and the opioid / fentanyl epidemic are a major concern for the Pittsfield area. The overdose rates per capita are higher in this community than many others in the Commonwealth. We address this issue and what is being done to address it, with programming.
- E. ARTS, ENTERTAINMENT, AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS: While the winter season is perhaps the slowest for many local cultural organizations, there is still much happening behind the scenes. These activities are of significant interest to listeners.
