Section I. Issues

This station has identified the following issues as significant ones that are facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **PITTSFIELD MUNICIPAL ELECTION:** This year's general municipal election, held on November 7th, featured races for mayor, all city council seats, all school committee seats, and city clerk. This election was closely followed by residents of the city, and many important issues were raised and discussed by the candidates during the campaign. Listeners desired to get live election results on the evening of the election.
- B. **LOCAL NEWS & POLITICS:** Beyond the topic of the municipal election, there are important topics to explore with state and local elected officials, which could benefit listeners. Often, WTBR is a primary source for listeners to better understand these issues.
- C. **VETERANS ISSUES**: Along with regular coverage of veterans' issues, during this quarter U.S. Air force Staff Sgt. Jacob Galliher, a 2018 Taconic High School Graduate, died along with seven of his fellow crew during a training exercise off the coast of Japan in late November. WTBR addresses the community's efforts to come together to bring him home.
- D. **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, TRANSPORTATION, AND PLANNING:** Several issues in this category featured prominently in community discussions this quarter, including hiring and job placement; digital equity; activities at the Berkshire Innovation Center; inflation and the economy; and the reconstruction of Wahconah Park.
- E. **EDUCATION:** As a Noncommercial Educational station, we often spotlight educational offerings at the elementary, secondary, and post-secondary levels. There are many issues to explore at all of these levels during the quarter.
- F. ARTS, ENTERTAINMENT, AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS: After the busy Berkshire summer arts and culture season, things slow down a bit in the fourth quarter. But there are still many activities and interests to explore in this space, and our programming reflects that.
