#### **Section I. Issues**

This station has identified the following issues as significant ones that are facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, TRANSPORTATION, AND PLANNING:** Many issues in this category were in the headlines and in the minds of listeners this quarter. For example, the health of downtown Pittsfield businesses, street traffic patterns and pedestrian safety, incentives for black-owned businesses, roads, bridges, and infrastructure concerns, and water and sewer costs were the top issues among city residents.
- B. **EDUCATION:** The end of the school year brings discussion surrounding many issues in the education community, for students, parents, and educators at the elementary, secondary, and post-secondary levels here in Pittsfield and the Berkshires. We attempt to address many of these issues on our programming. Opportunities for summer programs is also a topic of discussion.
- C. LOCAL NEWS & POLITICS: While the local municipal election is still months away, there is still robust discussion about state and ocal issues that arose during this quarter. It is now known that incumbent Mayor Linda Tyer will not seek a third four-year term in office. The state budget process is in full swing during the quarter, so we seek to learn more from our state representatives, as much of this information does not reach Berkshire County from Boston.
- D. DIVERSITY, EQUITY, AND INCLUSION: There are many issues surrounding this topic which are relevant during this quarter: Pride month celebrating the LGBTQ+ community in June; a local instance of antisemitism in a local school prompts much discussion; Juneteenth and other activities from our local NAACP branch; and other topics of DEI are important for our listeners.
- E. ARTS, ENTERTAINMENT, AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS: The important summer cultural season arrives during this quarter. It is a critical component of the Berkshire economy, and important for the edification of our residents as well. We hope to explore these opportunities for our listeners on WTBR programming.
