HART OF AUTISM – On Thursday, July 16th 2015, Hart of Autism held their monthly meeting at the Munfordville Baptist Church at 6:30 PM. Hart of Autism is a support group for educators, parents and children affected by Autism. Adults come together monthly for support, ideas and local resources. Children come and participate in therapeutic activities to build social, behavioral and communication skills. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM between July 1st through July 16th, 2015.

ABUNDANCE OF THE HART FOOD BANK – On Thursday and Friday, July 16th and 17th, 2015 the Abundance of the Hart Food Bank Commodity Program distributed food in the gym of Munfordville Baptist Church. Individuals had to meet household income eligibility guidelines provided by Feeding America and also had to show proof of their county of residency. Several hundreds of families benefit from this monthly program and rely on it to help feed their families. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM between July 1st through July 17th, 2015.

CRAM THE CRUISER – During the weekend of Friday, July 31st and Saturday, August 1st, 2015, the Hart County Sheriff's Department and the Horse Cave Police Department participated in the Cram the Cruiser events. WLOC hosts Dewayne Forbis and Lori Houchens did live on-air interviews with Hart County Sheriff, Boston Hensley on Friday, July 31st from 7:30 AM until 7:45 AM and Horse Cave Police Chief, Sean Henry on Wednesday, July 28th from 7:30 AM until 7:45 AM. The live interviews went into great detail of both events including the time, location and what school supplies were needed for our local schools in the Hart County and Caverna School Districts. WLOC Radio host, Dewayne Forbis also reported live from the scene at the Dollar General Store in Munfordville, KY with Sheriff Boston Hensley and the Hart County Sheriff's Department. Different police officers and members of the community were interviewed live on the radio throughout the afternoon event. WLOC Radio host, Dewayne Forbis also broadcasted live from the Horse Cave Police Department's Cram the Cruiser event at IGA in Horse Cave. Different officers and community and school officials were interviewed live on the air and described the different school supplies that were needed. They showed appreciation of the community's help by thanking everyone who participated and donated items to make the upcoming school year a big success.

CLOTHES CLOSET – On Friday, August 14th, Horse Cave Christian Church sponsored a Clothes Closet from 9:00 AM until 12:00 PM. Many members in the community were in need of clothing and this event helped clothe many individuals and families during the summer months. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM from July 25th through August 14th, 2015.

CIVIL WAR DAYS – On Friday, September 11th through Sunday, September 13th, 2015, the city of Munfordville celebrated their Civil War Heritage. Events included battle reenactments, living history camps and presentations, guided tours, games, music, food, booths and more. On Saturday, September 12th, 2015, radio hosts Dewayne Forbis, Lori Houchens and Chris Jessie broadcasted live from the event from 8:00 AM until 12:00 noon. Many individuals were interviewed live on air and talked about Munfordville’s involvement and history from the Civil War. Two minute alerts about the event were aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM from August 27th through September 13th, 2015.

HORSE CAVE HERITAGE FESTIVAL – On Friday and Saturday, September 18th and 19th, 2015, the Community of Horse Cave celebrated their history and heritage with the annual Horse Cave Heritage Festival. On Wednesday, September 16th, morning show hosts Dewayne Forbis, Lori Houchens and Chris Jessie did a live on-air interview with Ken Russell, the head representative of the Horse Cave Cultural District. Mr. Russell’s live interview was broadcast from 7:30 AM until 7:45 AM. The town’s history and the festival’s upcoming events and musical performances were discussed in great detail. On Friday, September 18th, 2015, radio host, Dewayne Forbis spoke with Randall Curry, mayor of Horse Cave regarding the upcoming heritage festival. The interview was a live on-air broadcast that aired from 7:30 AM until 7:45 AM. Mr. Curry went into great detail about the upcoming events, exhibits and all of the community’s hard work to make the event a learning opportunity and a huge success.
