OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX PROJECT – Through October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the Cave Country Lions Club sponsored Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Project. Girls and boys in over 150 countries have experienced the joy of Christmas thanks to the people who have packed over 100 million shoebox gifts since 1993. The boxes were accepted by October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013 and were taken to Calvary Baptist Church in Glasgow who transported them to a processing center. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM between October 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

CHRISTMAS ANGEL PROGRAM – The Salvation Army's Angel Tree Sign-up was held October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015 through October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2015. Sign-ups were for children in the Hart County School System and also included babies and toddlers who were not in school yet. Many individuals, families and organizations adopt/sponsor a child each year by providing them with gifts they need and want to have a memorable Christmas. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM from October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2015 through October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2015.

ABUNDANCE OF THE HART FOOD BANK – On Thursday and Friday, November 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the Abundance of the Hart Food Bank Commodity Program distributed food in the gym of Munfordville Baptist Church. Individuals must meet the household income eligibility guidelines provided by Feeding America and also had to show proof of their county of residency. Several hundreds of families benefit from this monthly program and rely on it to help feed their families. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM between November 1<sup>st</sup> through November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

CHRISTMAS ANGEL PROGRAM – Through November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2015, the Caverna Family Resource Youth Services Center had Christmas angels available for adoption. These angels are local children in the community whose parents or guardians cannot afford to buy them gifts for Christmas. Many individuals, families and organizations adopt/sponsor a child each year by providing them with gifts they need and want so they have a memorable Christmas. This two minute alert was aired three times daily at 6:30 AM, 7:30 AM and 9:30 AM from November 1<sup>st</sup> through November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2015.
