A regular schedule of non-profit agencies joined us for extended interview opportunities on News 4's Evening Break at 6:30 Monday, April 1:

The American Heart Association highlighted the upcoming National Walking Day, why walking is beneficial to health and how viewers could share their progress through social media.

Monday, April 4:

The Susan G. Komen Foundation discussed the upcoming Komen Race For the Cure, breast cancer facts and shared the story of a co-survivor.

Tuesday, April 5:

Catholic Charities came on the newscast to share their upcoming Ask-A-Lawyer event, a free event that put viewers in contact with lawyers, to answer their questions about any legal issue they may currently be experiencing.
