LOCAL MATTERS – Aired Sunday at 11:00 a.m. (Ends Jan. 13th) 30 min.

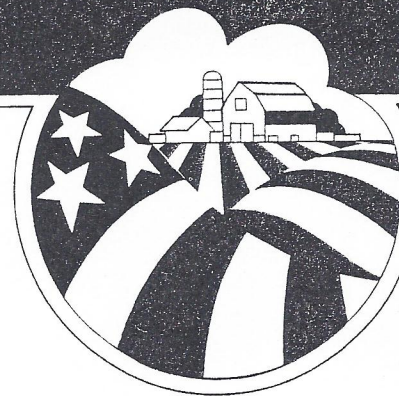
This program is produced locally and speaks to a variety of community issues facing this market as well as many outreach programs in which this community is currently engaged.

Regular features on "U.S. Farm Report" include national month-ahead weather forecasts with weekly updates, analysis and interpretation of market conditions and editorial comment on a wide variety of agricultural topics. "U.S. Farm Report" provides insightful reports with government officials including chairpersons of the House and Senate Agricultural Committees as well as the Secretary of Agriculture and his top aides. The program also explores international agricultural issues with spokespeople for the European Economic Community and representatives of other foreign countries.

"U.S. Farm Report" provides its audience with information unavailable elsewhere, such as the six-part intensive report on agricultural trade possibilities with the People's Republic of China, which was presented a full year before relations with that country were normalized. National farm organization meetings, featuring both officers and delegates, reports on research and education, regional fairs and expositions and special features on improved farming methods from all over the U.S. and abroad are highlighted. The series has broadcast reports on flour production, "no till" weed control, nursery and landscaping, experimental "alcohol rich" sugar beets and coal production as well as reports on major crops and regional crop specialties from

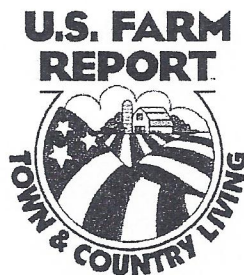

all over the nation. Livestock reports cover production, packing, experimental research studies and marketing innovations. Catfish and trout farming also are reported. Another popular feature with viewers is the country church salute, which highlights the history and activities of a different country church each week.

"U.S. Farm Report" with host Orion Samuelson stands as a unique example of programming that provides vital information to agribusiness and relates it in terms that consumers can understand. The series demonstrates the diversity of programming supported by commercial television. The satellite version permits inclusion of weekly Board of Trade and Mercantile Exchange market activity and coverage of late-breaking news affecting agribusiness.

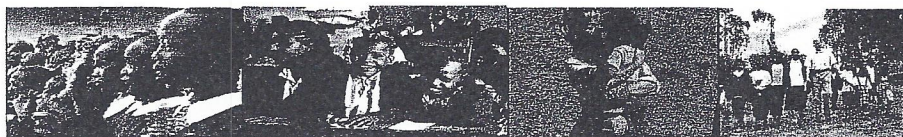

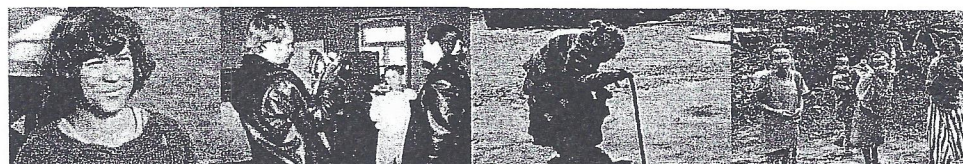
Each show is hosted by retired KTVX-TV news anchor, Kimberly Perkins.

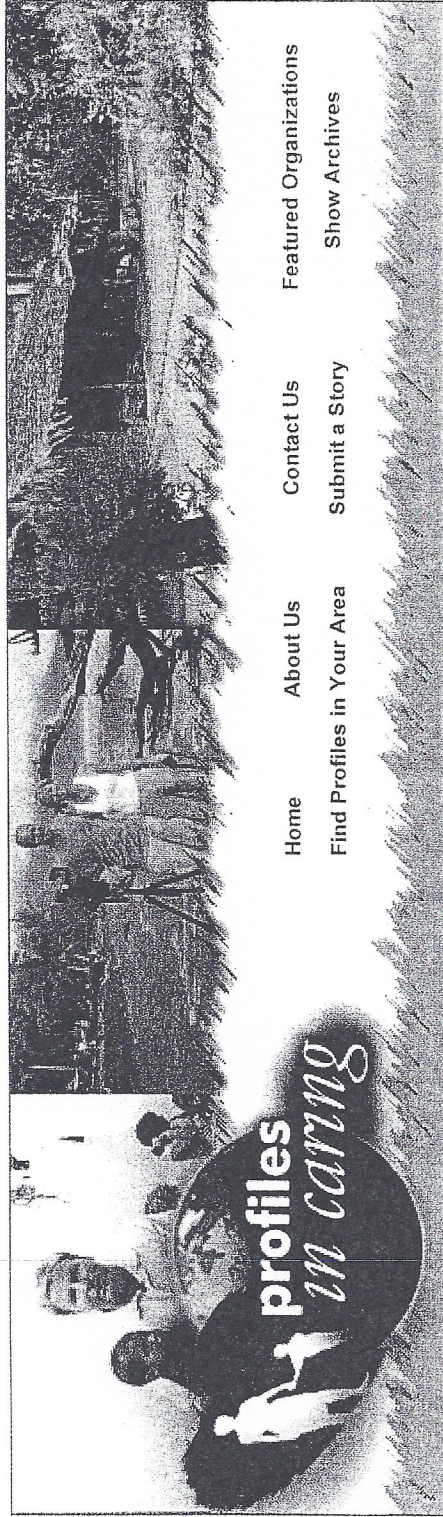

(1984-88). Her longest time was spent anchoring the 5:30 and 10:00PM weekday newscasts for KTVX-TV in Salt Lake City, from 1988 to December of 2000 - when she "retired" to spend more time with her husband Skip and 4 children. She won 2 Emmy awards during her tenure at KTVX-TV, and was the lead reporter for the station's successful "4 Utah Kids" and "Immunize by 2" campaigns. Kimberly now volunteers her time as founder, executive producer and host of "Profiles in Caring".

"It provides a way of seeing the planet and the myriad of interesting people and projects making it a better place - without the burden of reporting on the grim news that so often saturates the airwaves. 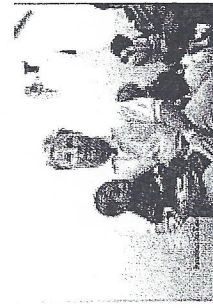
Lynn Peterson

Doug Jardine

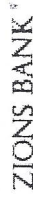
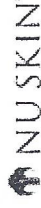

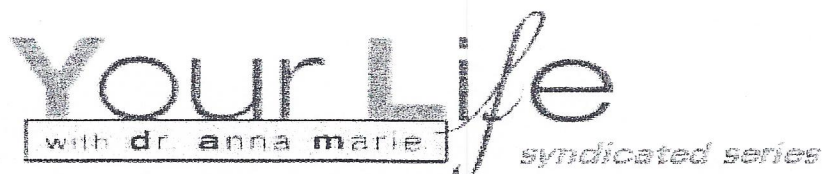

In addition to hosting her own show, Dr. Anna Marie is the health specialist for The Weather Channel. Her Weather Wellness reports air approximately sixty times per week. Dr. Anna Marie's Production company also produces a monthly Internal Medicine Report (IMR) for the American College of Physician's international medicine journal *The Annals of Internal Medicine*. The medical report is utilized by news organizations across the United States.
