This movement has been coming together, signing documents and pushing toward religious unity/understanding. This effort has resulted in the construction of a complex that's to be constructed called the 'Abrahamic Family House' that will be located near Abu Dhabi. This facility will house a church, synagogue and mosque in order to promote religious harmony.</p> <p>Joining Jim to discuss this trend was Shahram Hadian. Shahram is a former Muslim from Iran who came to the states in 1978 and committed his life to Jesus Christ. Shahram started the TIL Project, the Truth in Love Project, which exposes the true goal of Islam and the threat of Sharia in America. He has served as a pastor, a police officer, and a former candidate for Governor in Washington State.</p> <p>What is interfaith dialogue? Shahram communicated that biblical evangelism seeks to contrast the gospel with any other ideology. You see that with Hannah. She was discontented, yet she prayed out of the bitterness of her soul.</p> <p>Another distinction he made was between relational bitterness (like we see in Shimei in his attack on David) and circumstantial bitterness (as we see with Naomi).</p> <p>Is there a relationship between anger and bitterness? Dr. Ollila explained that when you look at Ephesians 4, bitterness and anger are mentioned in the same verse. So there has to be a connection. In these cases we are quenching/grieving the Spirit while at the same time God tells us to put away bitterness, wrath, anger and evil communication.</p> <p>When engaged in perpetual animosity, this causes people to be unable to rejoice because their heart is heavy and this can sometimes be traced to a seething bitterness.</p> <p>This Crosstalk uses the story of Ruth as a case study as it looks at the sources, symptoms, and solution to bitterness, and various sub-points within each of these categories.</p>  |

They work directly under the United Nations and their environmental program. The WWF also works with the World Resources Institute and the International Union of Conservation and Nature.</p> <p>Keep in mind that according to the WWF, in order to save the earth, one of the things that needs to be done is to reduce the consumption of beef. They've managed to work their way into the cattle industry. As proof, Tom cited the National Cattlemen's Beef Association, the largest beef association in America. (<a href="#">Colossians 4:18</a>) The writer of Hebrews said "Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body." (Hebrews 13, 3) Sunday, November 3<sup>rd</sup> is the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. Our guest today will help us understand (and even celebrate) the work that is being done by the global Church – by those who are being persecuted. Todd Nettleton is the Chief of Media Relations and Message Integration with Voice of the Martyrs. He has served some 20 years with VOM where he has travelled to many nations to interview hundreds of Christians who have endured persecution. He is also part of the writing team for four Voice of the Martyrs books.</p> <p>Crosstalk immediately addresses that which is considered "normal" for Christians in America – how it is not "normal" in 70 plus other countries. In fact, Todd says many of the things the Church practices freely here, often costs "someone, somewhere their job, their family, or they go to jail and/or sometimes are even killed in places where persecution is common." Despite all of this, regardless of where the persecuted Church is found, a common prayer request is "Pray for us." Todd says what is most challenging about this (even convicting) is that these we speak of are not asking prayer for their own situations, but prayer that they "will be faithful in spite of the persecution, in spite of the suffering, and will continue serving God in spite of what they may lose here on earth." They have also asked prayer for their persecutors. Todd says this Sunday's International Day of Prayer is a "key time for churches across the country, to answer the #1 request of our persecuted Church family." Will we pray? and then just check it off our list, until next November? Todd hopes not.</p> <p>To illustrate how very much alive Church persecution is, Crosstalk discusses North Korea; a place Todd calls "the most closed country in the world as far as the gospel is concerned." A place where "the Kim family (the leaders) are presented as divine beings. Where children in Kindergarten are taught to sit down at a meal and give thanks to Kim Il-Sung. For someone there to come along and say I follow Jesus Christ (not the Kims') it's treason." Tom described a deceptive practice that allows them to pretend that beef coming from other countries is American beef when actually it's only processed here.</p> <p>So why would the American cattle industry allow the WWF in when they seem to want to undo what the cattle industry is doing? Tom said he's been given two explanations for that. One is that cattlemen have been under siege for years by animal rights and environmental organizations. The cattlemen looked at this as a 'pressure valve' in the sense that if they would put the phrase 'sustainable' on their meat, this would get such groups off their back. Another explanation is that many who are members of the cattlemen's association aren't really cattlemen. Instead, some are meat packers, lawyers, environmentalists, etc. and they have moved in to control what's going on.</p> <p>Can we take seriously the accusations that raising cattle harms biodiversity and that livestock's contribution to environmental problems is massive? Would cattle grazing land be better utilized to raise wheat or soy? Is our freshwater supply at risk due to the raising of cattle? Why are we importing so much beef into the U.S.? Calvin Beisner. Dr. Beisner is the founder and national spokesman for The Cornwall Alliance for the Stewardship of Creation, a network of over 60 Christian theologians, natural scientists, economists, and other scholars educating for biblical earth stewardship, economic development for the poor, and the proclamation and defense of the good news of salvation by God's grace, received through faith in Jesus Christ's death and resurrection. He's the author of a dozen books, edited over 30 books and has contributed to another 35. The first is that in the 1970's/early 1980's California, along with the federal government, initiated policies against clearing undergrowth and deadwood from national and state forest lands. California also added rules making it difficult for private landowners to do this as well.</p> <p>This means that when a fire begins, since there's a lot of fuel available, it will burn hotter and spread faster. This is why we're seeing fires there that are comparable to those in centuries past before human management of the forests began.</p> <p>Secondly, California adopted a variety of energy policies that made it difficult for Pacific Gas and Electric to afford to keep its electrical lines and equipment in good repair. | 11/19 | Court Ties Jury Hands in Planned Parenthood Trial | Jim Schneider / Mat Staver  | <p>In recent years, shocking undercover videos were revealed to the public by those going undercover to report the involvement of Planned Parenthood in the trafficking of human baby body parts. As a result, Planned Parenthood launched a multi-million dollar civil lawsuit against Sandra Merritt and others for their undercover investigation which was a multiple weeks trial. Closing arguments were made last week.</p> <p>To discuss this important case is Attorney Mat Staver, the founder and chairman of Liberty Counsel.</p> <p>Sandra Merritt (represented by Liberty Counsel) and David Daleiden began to investigate Planned Parenthood. They read journals, spoke with experts, and also viewed an ABC News 2020 report from the year 2000 that involved undercover investigation regarding the harvesting of baby body parts by the abortion industry for profit. They also spoke with sidewalk counselors who inquired why delivery trucks were coming up to an abortion clinic and taking away boxes. They then began recording videos in public places featuring high level executives within Planned Parenthood, as well as individuals who worked with organ procurement businesses such as StemExpress. The result is that they found out babies were being manipulated during birth for the extraction of various body parts. Some were being sold online to research labs for up to \$17,000 apiece.</p> <p>As a result, Planned Parenthood filed a multi-million dollar lawsuit in San Francisco and the California Attorney General filed 15 felony charges against Sandra and David.</p> <p>Thus far there has been a 3 week state criminal hearing. Mat is waiting on a judge to see if they have to go back for a full-blown jury trial in criminal court. After nearly 7 weeks of trial in San Francisco, they just got the verdict last Friday which found in favor of Planned Parenthood, awarding over 2 million dollars in total damages.</p> <p>Mat indicated that Judge William Orrick III erroneously allowed a federal law known as the 'Racketeer Influence Corrupt Organization' (RICO) law to go forward as part of the suit so any damage award is tripled.</p> <p>The judge has a connection to Planned Parenthood but did not recuse himself. In addition, the jury was given a set of instructions by the judge which required a verdict of guilt. | 11/29 | The harmful Effects of Vaping                 | Jim Schneider / Dr. David Stevens | <p>Dr. David Stevens is the Chief Executive Officer of the Christian Medical &amp; Dental Association, the nation's largest faith-based organization of healthcare professionals. Dr. Stevens has also served as a missionary doctor in Kenya for some 10 years. He also has conducted numerous seminars on such issues as stem cell research, human cloning, genetics, faith and health, physician-assisted suicide, abortion and other topics.</p> <p>Dr. Stevens described how a lot of work by the government and other groups went into speaking out against smoking. By 1997, statistics showed that about 1 out of 3 students smoked combustible cigarettes. That began to drop to such an extent that now middle school smoking levels are at about 1.8% (1 out of 50 that smoke cigarettes)</p> <p>Then in 2011 vaping came on the scene. It involves the use of a mechanical cigarette (electronic or 'e-cigarette'). Through a heating</p>  |

|      |                            |                            | <p>element, this mechanical cigarette (which comes from China) vaporizes a liquid that contains nicotine without causing a foul smell. Vaping can be done with THC (the active ingredient in marijuana) and also cocaine.</p> <p>What scares Dr. Stevens is that from 2017 to 2018, the percentage of students almost doubled their use to where at the end of 2018 about 20% of 12<sup>th</sup> graders and about 6% of 8<sup>th</sup> graders said they were vaping.</p> <p>Vaping is becoming popular because the mechanical cigarettes are easy to hide in school, you can't smell it and flavors are available that include bubble gum, apple pie, watermelon and peanut butter. Dr. Stevens did some research and found that there were 7,700 unique flavors of nicotine-containing liquids and that the number is increasing at the rate of 242 flavors per month.</p> <p>Vaping was introduced as a method to get away from the use of regular cigarettes. That has proven not to be the case as those who vape tend to use this method of smoking more than cigarettes thinking that it's harmless. The result is that it's become a 'gateway' mechanism to smoking regular cigarettes as 3 out of 4 people that vape also smoke cigarettes.</p> <p>Jim also noted that 40% of young e-cigarette users had never smoked regular tobacco so it's like there's a whole new market that is falling prey to this trend.</p> <p>Is it safe? Dr. Stevens admitted it doesn't have some of the same carcinogens like traditional smoking but it does have some, it has toxins, heavy metals, diacetyl and an ultra fine vapor that penetrates deeper into the lungs than regular cigarette smoke.</p> <p>The big danger is Bronchiolitis Obliterans ('Popcorn Lung'). This is a dissolving of portions of the lung tissue. The disease also impairs your ability to fight infection and because the immune system doesn't work well it causes an inflammatory response in your airways.</p> |
