Santa Rosa County's food services director, Leslie Bell, says they need this program now more than ever due to high food prices. The school district says they serve around 300 to 400 students every day and those numbers are continuing to rise.</p>

Education/School Start	Channel 3 News – 10pm	March 9th	10:00pm	:39	A Bill in the Florida House would give teenagers more sleep before their school days start. House Bill 733 would mandate that middle school students could not start classes before 8am. High school kids could not start their classes before 8:30am. In an analysis by the American Academy of Pediatrics attached to the Bill, it says research shows that high school kids have difficulty falling asleep before 11pm and they do best when they get to wake up after 8am.

Gas stations are averaging around two dollars and ninety-seven cents according to Gas Buddy. The cost of fuel in Pensacola is still three cents lower per gallon than a month ago. It's also sixteen cents per gallon lower than a year ago.
Economy/Used Car Prices Down	Channel 3 News – 10pm	January 16th	10:00pm	:20	Used car prices have dropped. That's according to data from Edmunds, an online informational resource on cars. They say the decline revolves around higher interest rates which make it harder to finance a car. That can limit consumer demand. According to Edmunds, the price of older used cars have fallen fifteen percent or more from their peaks in early 2022.

That's their smallest rate hike since March of last year. But officials make it clear they're nowhere close to the end of their fight to tame inflation.

It's one of the first experimental dementia drugs, used to slow cognitive decline. Accelerated approval allows for earlier approval of drugs that treat serious conditions. The drug has shown potential as an Alzheimer's treatment.</p>

The CDC says flu and RSV have peaked but other respiratory viruses remain high or very high in about half of the states in the US.</p>

According to the CDC's new survey, girl's mental health is declining across the U.S. compared to boys. Six in ten girls felt persistently sad or lonely. That's nearly double the rate of teen boys. Nearly one in three teen girls gave serious thought to attempting suicide. Parental support is critical for teens when it comes to helping fix this problem.

To keep yourself safe, be sure to leave wildlife alone and wash any bites or scratches immediately with soap and water.</p>
