10 years ago, Paul Trama was on our set to talk about his work in the community as the Coordinator of the PELL Radio Reading Services in conjunction with the Lackawanna Blind Association. Their mission is to support and promote the interests of the blind, visually impaired and the prevention of unnecessary blindness in Lackawanna County. Its great to have him back on the show to tell us all the great programs they have implemented and how the association has really grown over the years. As a reading service, they read/broadcast the Times Tribune live Monday thru Friday from 8am - 10am On WUSR (University of Scranton's radio station) 99.5 FM and online at WUSRFM.com. Its primarily for the visually impaired but they invite anyone to tune in if they are too busy or on their morning commute. They consist of 20 volunteers some of them have been giving their time for 20 years. Its been such an important part of our community. They find its not only a source of information, but companionship. The association has been in existence since about 1912 and Paul goes into the client support services they offer. Caseworkers are brought in to help find out their needs especially for those who have lost their sight late in life. Other services include sensory development program, life skills program, support groups, van transportation, shopping trips, movie day and an audio book club. Paul got involved back in 1981 when he was a student at the University of Scranton and he volunteered his time for the reading service. Its great to see that he's so passionate about what he does for the community.

For music fans Paul would also like us to know that he hosts his own show on WUSR "Spotlight" every Friday morning at 7:30am. He plays a variety of artists from the 60's 70's and 80's and likes to throw in local artists when he can. www.lackawannablind.org

As the disease advances, symptoms can include problems with language, disorientation, mood swings, loss of motivation, not managing self care, and behavioral issues. Alzheimer's is not necessarily a normal part of aging, but the majority of people with Alzheimer's are 65 and older. Alzheimer's is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States. Those with Alzheimer's live an average of eight years after their symptoms become noticeable to others, but survival can range from four to 20 years, depending on age and other health conditions.

The walk includes the residents and their families and friends. They walk around the perimeter of the building and even though it's a short distance its very meaningful.
