THAT INCLUDES IMPOSING AN EIGHT HOUR WORK DAY, REQUIRING DISABILITY AND UNEMPLOYMENT COVERAGE, AND ALLOWING FARM WORKERS TO FORM UNIONS AND COLLECTIVELY BARGAIN. THAT STATE FARM BUREAU IS AGAINST THE PROPOSAL, SAYING IT WOULD CRIPPLE FAMILY FARMS.
