OVER A THIRD OF NEW YORKERS SAY THEY'LL HAVE TO MOVE TO FIND BETTER ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES. THAT'S ACCORDING TO A NEW QUINNIPIAC UNIVERSITY POLL. IT ALSO FOUND 35 PERCENT OF RESIDENTS SAYING THEY CAN'T AFFORD TO LIVE IN THE STATE, WITH THAT PERCENTAGE SOARING TO 45 PERCENT DOWNSTATE. THE NEW RESULTS COME AMID GROWING CONCERN IN ALBANY ABOUT THE NUMBER OF TAXPAYERS FLEEING THE STATE, A PROBLEM THEY SAY IS BEING EXACERBATED BY CHANGES IN FEDERAL TAX LAW.
