Birthing Justice

Description: Giving birth has turned into a battleground for too many Black women and their babies. Going behind the statistics and beyond grief, Birthing Justice places Black women at the center of the fight to fix a broken system as they transform the future for all women in this country. The documentary focuses on the progress being made by those on the frontline of this crisis and highlights solutions that can be replicated in communities across the country. In order to assure a broad spectrum of experiences, the program focuses on Missouri, Georgia, California and the District of Columbia and elevate the lived experiences of Black women including 11-time Olympic champion, Allyson Felix and advocates like Dr. Joia Crear-Perry, founder of the National Black Equity Collaborative. Birthing Justice combines expert interviews with very personal pregnancy and birth stories that emphasize the dangerous terrain many traverse while celebrating their joyful outcomes.

As viewers are taken on their journey from seclusion to inclusion, they realize that the aggregate stories of these brave individuals share a powerful message of HOPE.

<u>Unconditional: Healing Hidden Wounds</u>

Filmed over seven years, the cinema verité film follows three very different families as they discover the impacts, stresses and rewards of caregiving for their loved ones living with disabilities.

The Man Who Saved 669 Children

Description: He never considered himself a hero, yet on the eve of World War II Nicholas Winton became THE MAN WHO SAVED 669 CHILDREN. Winton, a young London banker, was on the verge of departing for a skiing vacation on Christmas 1938 when a friend called him from Prague asking for help. In the Czechoslovakian capital, Winton sets up an extraordinary rescue operation for Jewish children threatened by the Nazis. From his hotel room, he organizes the departure of trains to England and becomes a forger when he lacks authorizations and visas. His efforts allowed 669 children to board eight trains and make their way to London to find host families, new lives, and hope.

Arab Americans

Description: The Arab Americans is the new 60-minute documentary illustrating the contributions made to the American fabric for almost 200 years by those who immigrated to the United States from the Middle East, North Africa and the Arabian Peninsula. This untold story vividly paints a portrait of the Arab-American immigrant experience through the stories of people who, like all Americans, immigrated in pursuit of the American Dream, including Senator George Mitchell, actor Jamie Farr, General John Abizaid, NYT foreign correspondent Anthony Shadid, Helen Thomas and more. With historical immigration patterns as background, the film explores the personal stories of Arab-Americans and how they have contributed to the collective American experience. At a time when the media tends to paint people from Arabic speaking countries and culture with the broad brush of terrorism, it is increasingly important to present a positive image of the many people of the Middle East, North Africa and the Arabian Peninsula who have made America their home, and highlight their American journey as an important part of the larger American Experience.
