Section I. Issues.

A. COMMUNITY ENRICHMENT & IMPROVEMENT

"Community Spotlight Program"---Air Date 4/11/21 at 8:15am

Topic: Northwoods Habitat For Humanity Executive Director Geri Hickerson and Board Member Seth Kilde are interviewed about the Habitat For Humanity program. The organization is looking for partner families for the upcoming building season. Habitat For Humanity builds homes for people who couldn't qualify for traditional financing. They contribute with "sweat" equity and volunteering in exchange for a low payment, no interest loan. This improves the community by providing residents with better living situations and new homes enhance the local neighborhoods and increase the value of the existing homes.
