Outdoor Burning Guidelines. Campfires are currently not permitted. Charcoal Grilling is not permitted, gas is allowed. Outdoor welding and cutting is permitted but under the following rules. wind must be < 15mph, humidity must be > 30%, area must be cleared of brush and debris from 25ft around welding site, two adults must be present to watch site, and must have pressurized water source on site. Above ground welding must abide by all previous rules in addition 2ft of cleared land per 1ft above ground that welding occurs.

Attorney General Abbott offered the following tips for Citizens approached by someone offering to rebuild or repair property: 1. Get more than one estimate. Don't be pushed into signing a contract immediately. 2. Ask the Better Business Bureau if it has any complaints about the company. 3. Get references from previous customers and check them out. 4. Get the salesperson's license plate number. 5. Deal with local firms, if possible. 6. Get everything in writing and keep the documents in a safe place. 7. Do not sign a contract with blank spaces. Dishonest salespersons may enter unacceptable terms later. 8. Ask for proof of insurance. 9 Never pay 100 percent up front. Arrange for an independent agent to inspect the completed work before making full payment. 10. Ask whether the contractor will place a lien, security interest or mortgage on your property. 11. Ask for guarantees in writing.
