- KEOK / KTLQ broadcasted live during the May 21<sup>st</sup> 2019 tornado that tracked through Peggs in Cherokee County in Oklahoma. In May and June the stations also had coverage after the storm with a representative from the SBA, and aired information about the relief efforts from various benefits that are supporting clean up and repairs.
- 2. KEOK / KTLQ reported on record flooding in Muskogee, Wagoner and Cherokee counties regarding the storm damage, and flooding in May 2019. Also conducted a morning show interview's detailing the flood and safety for residents living in the flooded areas.
- KEOK / KTLQ have partnered with the Oklahoma Blood Institute with continuing efforts in April,
   May and June to get blood donations from the community. Various Blood Drives from the OBI and interviews continue on the radio in order to keep the supply of blood to local hospitals.

TACO supports all of the charities around Lake Tenkiller, they were hit by the November 30<sup>th</sup> Tornado. Lakes Country radio also held a Listener Appreciation show and concert in conjunction with the 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Cookson Jubilee in June. Also helped raise money with efforts on the air geared towards listener donations to the TACO Organization.
