

Issues and Programs KGHI FM 91.1/KGHE FM 89.1 1st Quarter January – March 2024

KGHI/KGHE is a 100% volunteer based rural community radio station that broadcasts information, arts, and entertainment for the Central Coast of Washington. It began broadcasting in March 2011.

KGHI FM 91.1 and our simulcast KGHI FM 89.1 programming is designed to educate, inform and entertain in a manner that helps promote democratic ideals consistent with ending poverty, racism and advancing human, worker, environmental, civil, social justice, educational and health rights. On July 18, 2015, KGHI 91.5 moved to a new frequency 91.1 to provide a more robust signal with less interference from competing signals. On September 6, 2019 the FCC granted a City of License change for KGHE 89.1 from Elma to Montesano. This was a move in preparation for moving the transmitter and antenna from its present location to a tower on top of “Cosi Hill” where we could more adequately serve our potential audience. The tower move had to be abandoned when a storm toppled the tower at the new location, and the cost of replacement was prohibitive. We will stay at the present KGHE tower location.
