A flood watch is in effect for eastern North Carolina including Hatteras Island through 8 p.m., tonight, Wednesday, September 24.

A MOIST AIRMASS is COMBINING WITH AN INLAND MOVING TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE TO PRODUCE HEAVY RAIN, ESPECIALLY NEAR COASTAL SECTIONS OF NORTH CAROLINA THROUGH MUCH OF TODAY, reports the National Weather Service in Newport.

One to two inches of rain today CAN BE EXPECTED WITH SOME HIGHER AMOUNTS POSSIBLE, predicts the weather service.

AREAS THAT HAVE RECENTLY RECEIVED HEAVIER RAIN WILL BE ESPECIALLY VULNERABLE TO FLOODING, states the weather service.

This morning, NC 12 remains open for travel. Very heavy rain produced ponding, sheets of water coursing across NC 12 and full ditches in Rodanthe.

At the south end of the Pea Island bridge, ocean water was pushing across NC 12.

For today, the weather service is predicting a southeast wind blowing 20 to 26 miles per hour. Tonight, the wind was expected to shift to the south and blow around 15 to 17 miles per hour. More rain is expected.
