(1) Coronavirus	Regular News/ WMOH Morning Show Live News Conferences Heavy PSA Rotation	4/1-6/30 Daily Coverage	12:00a-11:59p	30 Hours	WMOH continued our extensive daily coverage of the COVID-19 outbreak, and its effects on the local and state economy and education. Aside from regular news coverage, morning show hosts have local, state, national, and world updates. WMOH ALSO carried Governor DeWine's news conferences live, when warranted, and ran PSA's recorded by the governor and his COVID-19 TEAM. We also reported on the ongoing vaccine distribution plans. We also covered the negative repercussions of the governor's orders.
(2) Education/CRT	Regular News/ WMOH Morning Show	4/13, 4/27, 5/11, 6/18	6a-9a 9a-6p	30 Minutes	WMOH covered school board meetings where a growing number of parents were beginning to speak out against Critical Race Theory and other controversial topics being taught in local classrooms.
(3) Train Depot	Regular News/WMOH Morning Show	4/29, 5/27, 6/10	6a-9a 9a-6p	30 minutes	Hamilton City Council struggled with the issue of whether to save a century old train depot downtown. Council eventually voted 5-2 to take ownership of the structure, and move it a block north onto city owned property.
(4) COSTCO Development	Regular News/ WMOH Morning Show	6/9, 6/22	6a-9a 9a-6p	30 minutes	Liberty Township officials announced plans for a new Costco store and mixed use development near the Voice of America area. Neighbors were concerned about noise and crime during a public hearing on the proposal.
(5) Highway Safety	Regular News/ WMOH Morning Show	5/21, 5/28	6a-9a 9a-6p	20 minutes	The Ohio State Patrol and local police launched their annual seat belt, impaired driving, and distracted driving campaigns for the summer.
(6) State General Assembly Updates	Regular News/ WMOH Morning Show	4/8, 5/14, 6/11, 6/16, 6/17, 6/23, 6/25	6a-9a 9a-6p	20 minutes	WMOH reported on proposals introduced by local state lawmakers in Columbus. We also covered speeches made by the lawmakers on the House and Senate floors.
(7) Mask/Vax mandates	Regular News/ WMOH Morning Show/	5/6, 6/23	6a-9a 9a-6p	20 minutes	Local governments and private businesses started lifting mask mandates as the Coronavirus rates fell in the area. Several members of the public spoke out at local meetings, calling for a permanent moratorium on mask rules.
