3. **Health:** Provided information concerning mental health issues with the “I can’t Breathe Program.

## **January February March 2021**

We interviewed Jamie Broom representative with The MLK Society about the 2021 MLK Parade and associated events along with the changes to events this year due to the pandemic. We interviewed Darren from the “I can’t Breathe Program” designed to deal with and aid people in the African American community in a mental health capacity. Discussed the program based in Oklahoma City and creating a Tulsa Branch. We also interviewed Jamaal Dyer about the Tulsa Public Schools EDGE Program, a pilot program launched under the early college high school with Union Public Schools in 2018. Edge follows the same model focusing on serving lower socioeconomic, first generation underserved populations.
