## **October 2023**

We conducted on air interviews with representatives of the free community even called the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Youth Conference put on by the New Life Training Center. The theme being Thinking Towards your future, for teens from 7th-12th grade. Topics covered during the event included: Banking 101, How to budget, Mental Health Awareness, Life skills and careers.

## **November 2023**

We conducted a live on-air interview concerning The North Tulsa Rock The Block Health Fair. Free to the public at Lacy park from 10am-3pm. Activities included were: Free Immunizations, Free Health screenings, Help with health insurance, 40+ vendors and more.

We also conducted our yearly station Thanksgiving Free turkey giveaway with sponsors to the public on a first come first serve basis before Thanksgiving day downtown Tulsa in the Greenwood district.

## **December 2023**

We conducted a live on-air interview with members of the MLK society, talking about the coming January 2024 festivities in celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King Day, including the 45<sup>th</sup> MLK parade, and the MLK jr. Day of Service. Following the parade members of the community will meet at Monroe Demonstration Academy to work together toward a stronger more connected community. Volunteers from across the city will come together to transform and beautify a school space with murals, painting and light construction projects in an effort to reconnect, transform, uplift and inspire the students, staff and community.
