It is our endeavor to serve the public interest. Station KJMM 105.3 FM broadcast programming responsive to issues of concern to the state of Oklahoma and its listening public. The following is a brief description of these issues and the station's most significant programming treatment of them: Issues important to this quarter including the following: Doing a live broadcast with interviews and information during the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Sickle Cell Walk, Run, Jog for a cure at Langston University Tulsa. The event also included a Health Expo with vision screenings and other health info available free to the public.

Also, an in studio interviews with Oklahoma Fosters in conjunction with Oklahoma Department of Human Services about the need in the state for foster parents. Oklahoma Fosters uses a grassroots approach to coordinate foster care recruitment efforts between government, business, faith and nonprofit organizations to solve the foster care crisis in Oklahoma.

Finally, we helped Tulsa celebrate the 1 year anniversary of one of the top ranked parks in the world, The Gathering Place with a live broadcast of our nationally syndicated morning show The Rickey Smiley Morning show. The event was free and open to the public and broadcast live nationwide, with segments of interviews with local entrepreneurs and more.
