Ag Issues

(April 5, 2018 – Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

State Representatives Don Hineman and Larry Hibbard joined us on the program. They looked at what the legislature has passed, and addressed one looming issue.....increased funding for Kansas schools without raising taxes.

(April 10 – Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Montgomery County farmer Rich Felts, who is the current president of the Kansas Farm Bureau, talked about farmer attitudes as spring planting begins. He also talked about the lack of moisture in much of the state, and farmer concerns over export markets in the wake of increasingly hostile trade talk between the U.S. and China.

(April 20 - Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Dan Johnson hosted a program looking at threats to cyber security in agriculture and the U.S. food industry. His guest said it's a growing problem that government regulators should address.

(May 3– Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Greg Akagi's guest was Texas Congressman Mike Conaway, who chairs the House Agriculture Committee. Conaway laid out his timetable for the new Farm Bill and what changes are needed to make the current Farm Bill work better for producers. He also expressed deep concern over the steep drop in farm income over the last few years.

(May 16 – Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Ann Sorenson with the American Farm Trust talked about a new report showing a sharp loss of farmland in the United States. Most of the loss can be attributed to urban sprawl. She expressed concern that more need to be done to protect productive farm ground.

(May 22– Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Greg Akagi visited with an official from the Kansas Department of Agriculture about a new state law allowing limited production of industrial hemp in Kansas. The law also allowed expanded research on the crop at Kansas State University.

(June 5 – Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Former national Corn Growers Association President Ken McCauley of White Cloud expressed concern over EPA action granting Renewable Fuel Standard waivers to nearly two dozen small U.S. refineries. He said the waivers have undercut U.S. demand for ethanol by nearly 1.6 billion gallons and run counter to U.S. law and the intent of Congress.

(June 11- Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Chuck Connor with the National Council for Farmer Cooperatives talked about the Accurate Label Act passed by Congress. The measure will force food manufacturers to make consumers aware of what food products actually contain, and prevent products from being misrepresented.

(June 19 – Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Randy Bicksut with National Farmers Company looked at their latest report on U.S farmland values. Higher quality land is still selling fairly well, but the market for lower quality land is “soft”, with those values actually declining over the past year.

(June 21 – Ag Issues 6-6:30 am)

Charles Atkinson, a farmer from Great Bend talked the impact of proposed Chinese tariffs on U.S. soybeans set to take effect on July 6. Atkinson, who serves on the board of the American Soybean Association, said the tariffs could cost U.S. soybean growers \$6 billion in losses over the next year.
