JULY 2017

- 1. TNS under federal investigation: (July 5, 2017) An ongoing federal investigation involving Texas Neighborhood Services has been revealed. The Weatherford-based nonprofit's Head Start and Early Head Start funding ended on Thursday, and the federal government said TNS was not awarded continued funding after the "application review revealed a number of fiscal issues and led CPA reviewers to consider TNS a 'high-risk' applicant."
- 2. Briles asks to be removed from lawsuit: (July 7, 2017) Legendary Stephenville High and Baylor University football coach Art Briles is asking a federal judge to remove him as a defendant in a lawsuit that alleges the school ignored a woman's claims she was sexually assaulted by a football player.
- 3. Sundown on the Square coming soon: (July 11, 2017) This year's Sundown on the Square event is expected to focus on Stephenville's Western heritage and be even bigger than last year. It will feature everything from wine tasting to rodeo activities, world champion cowboys, an art exhibit, Western craft vendors, a mechanical bull and music on Saturday, Oct. 8, in downtown Stephenville.
- 4. Alleged assailant in correction officer's death not yet charged: (July 19, 2017) Authorities say the 21-year-old male inmate identified as the "alleged assailant" in the killing of a female corrections officer at an Abilene prison over the weekend allegedly attacked the woman as she entered a storage area near the kitchen.
- 5. MOWEC funded by Erath County Commissioners: (July 26, 2017) A grant of \$18,000 to Meals on Wheels of Erath County was renewed unanimously by the Erath County Commissioners Court at their regular meeting on Monday morning. The annual grant funds a longstanding cooperation between Erath County and Meals on Wheels that serves to assist homebound senior citizens in receiving home-delivered hot meals each day.
