As a part of the Clean Water Act, the EPA is requiring cities to upgrade their systems. The typical residential user's bill for 4,000 gallons would go from \$27.12 a month to \$35.83 next year. Then \$38.74 in 2015 and \$45.72 in 2016. That's an increase of more than \$18.

He says 98 percent of the 39 schools stayed the same or improved compared to last year. Smith adds the number of failing schools has been decreased by 50 percent.

But opponents worry easier access to guns could lead to school shootings. The bill originally was intended to ban public gun buy-backs in Indiana, but lawmakers gutted that language.
