Public Affairs Program Schedule and Description

1. PUBLIC AFFAIRS

(Sundays, 6:00 a.m.-7:00 a.m.) Locally developed, hosted and produced by Cody Robinson. This topical weekly program features community organizations, events and activities of interest to people living in the greater Sacramento region, including nonprofits and agencies that provide various outreach, education and support services.

ISSUE: ENVIRONMENT

SAC ELECTRIC VEHICLES

October 6, 2019 6:00 a.m. 25 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Thomas Haal, executive director of Clean Start and SacEV board member, to promote clean tech in the greater Sacramento region, specifically electric vehicles. He discussed the switch to EVs, the benefits that comes with it, including environmental and cost, and the EV Showcase at Sacramento International Auto Show from October 18-20th. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

REGIONAL WATER AUTHORITY

October 20, 2019 6:13 a.m. 18 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Amy Talbot, water efficiency program manager for the Regional Water Authority, a joint powers authority representing two dozen water providers and affiliates in the greater Sacramento region. She discussed water conservation during the fall and indoors, why this is a good time to plant and update your sprinkler system, and available rebates on water efficient products. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

ISSUE: ENVIRONMENT (CONT.)

PLACER LAND TRUST

October 27, 2019 + December 22, 2019 6:00 a.m. 39 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Kara Walker, develop and communications director, and Justin Wages, land manager, of Placer Land Trust, which works with willing landowners and conservation partners to preserve over 10,000 acres of natural and agricultural land in Placer County. They discussed the importance of preserving land for environmental reasons and for future generations to enjoy, how they maintain the preserved land, and their upcoming free guided hikes. CALIFORNIA DEPT OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES

October 6, 2019 6:25 a.m. 45 mins of a 60 min program

Today's program featured Marleese Perez and Michael Freeman, employees of the California Department of Health Care Services, to discuss the growing opioid addiction crisis, stigma regarding it, what steps they're taking to combat it, and how to get help in the Sacramento region. They also defined Opioid Use Disorder and Medication Assisted Treatment. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

KEVIN BRACY

October 14, 2019 + December 29, 2019 6:40 a.m.
20 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Kevin Bracy, the Sacramento-area author and motivational speaker known as "Coach Greatness." He got the name by helping others find the greatness in them. He discussed his REACH One Alliance program, which aims to create a positive shift in school climate, his It Takes Guts nonprofit for children suffering from chronic illness, and the "Win the Week" challenge with California Family Fitness. The 7 week program motivates those who sign up on October 14th to put their health and wellness 1st starting November 4th before the New Year. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

SUNDANCE FARMS

October 14, 2019 + December 29, 2019 6:00 a.m. 40 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Julie Vance, founder of Sundance Farms Equine Rescue, a nonprofit based in Shingle Springs dedicated to saving horses from slaughter, abuse and neglect. She discussed rehabilitating horses, giving them purpose and later using them in riding lesson programs, day camps, equine assisted therapies, and birthday parties. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

NORCAL BULLY BREED RESCUE

December 15, 2019 6:27 a.m. 33 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Kelly Guerriero, communications director for NorCal Bully Breed Rescue, a nonprofit foster based rescue dedicated to helping bully breeds that are in need of assistance, whether they be shelter dogs or strays. She discussed misconceptions about bully breeds, the need for fosters, how to adopt, and their current social media star, Quincy, an English bulldog puppy with a cleft lip who was almost euthanized. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

ISSUE: MENTAL HEALTH

NOT OK PROJECT October 20, 2019 6:00 a.m. 13 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Jason Williams, vice president of Not Ok Project, a nonprofit that provides resources, training and hands-on programs for first responders who have been affected by PTSD and work-related traumatic incidents. He discussed their 3 tier program: call-in service, 3 alarm response, and in-service training. He also mentioned the Trail Brothers Horse Riding event on November 3rd at Gibson Ranch and where 1st responders can sign up. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

ISSUE: FOSTER SERVICES

TICKET TO DREAM

October 20, 2019 6:31 a.m. 29 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Gina Davis, executive director of Ticket to Dream, a nonprofit dedicated to providing hope and opportunity to foster youth across the nation. They join forces with businesses and local communities to ensure foster youth have school supplies, holiday gifts, properly fitting clothes and shoes that they need to thrive. She discussed how they expanded from getting their start in Sacramento, their holiday toy drives, and goals for the new year. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

AGING UP

November 17, 2019 6:33 a.m. 27 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured April Johnson, cofounder and communication director of Aging Up, a nonprofit that aims to empower youth in foster care with experience to successfully transition into adulthood. They use 3 pillar services, free-of-charge, to Sacramento Region youth (ages 13-17) who have had any experience in foster care by offering one-to-one mentoring, age-appropriate recreation, and independent living skills education. She's here to discuss the mentoring programs, what it takes to be a mentor, and life-skill workshops. Locally hosted and produced by Cody Robinson.

ST JOHN'S PROGRAM FOR REAL CHANGE

October 27, 2019 + December 22, 2019 6:37 a.m.
23 minutes of a 60-minute program

Today's program featured Michelle Steed, executive director of St John's Program for Real Change, a nonprofit program for homeless women and children who are victims of domestic violence or suffering from drug and alcohol addiction or mental illness. St. John provides shelter, job training, and child care. She discussed their shelters and programs, including the Plates restaurants and catering, First Steps childcare center, and their Party for a Change on November 2nd at Mather Jet Center. They discussed the American Heart Association's purpose and mission, November being National Eat Smart Month, what it means to Eat Smart, tips on eating healthier, and how to make better choices during the holiday season. Today's program featured Cpl. Jeff Landay, a Sacramento-area veteran who suffered a devastating brain injury in 2006 during a roadside attack in Iraq. For a special Veteran's Day show, he discussed why he joined the U.S. Marines, his experience serving our country, what he wants others to know before serving, how being injured changed his life, recovery, and what the holiday means to him. Today's program featured Lt. Col. Michael Firmin, the commander of the Northern California Recruiting Battalion for the US Army. He discussed why military service is beneficial to an individual and the nation and the meaning of being a public servant. They went into detail on what to considering before joining, the benefits that come along with service, skills learned and the career opportunities that come from them, and strengthening physical and mental health. PARKINGSON'S FOUNDATION - MOVING DAY
