MUSIC FOR A CAUSE

April 7, 2019 6:29 a.m. 31 mins of a 60 min program

Today's program featured Elizabeth Showerman and Bob Seaton, founders of Music for the Cause, a nonprofit dedicated to helping those with rare bleeding disorders and spreading awareness through music. The NorCal-based organization holds an annual national songwriting competition to showcase up and coming artists while raising awareness for the bleed disorder community. They discussed bleeding disorders, how they help those with these disorders, the 2019 songwriting competition that closes May 15th and what artists can get out of it. AMADOR VINTERS ASSOCIATION

They discussed the Amador Four Fires Festival, a celebration of the four distinctive wine regions that inspire Amador winemakers and winegrowers: Southern France, Italy, Iberia, and "Heritage California". The festival on May 4th at Amador County Fairgrounds features wine tasting, food prepared by local chefs, and educational seminars. They also mentioned how the event benefits the Amador County Fairgrounds, which provides the community with a year-round event facility that showcases agricultural, historical and cultural diversity. They also talked about their fundraising efforts, which includes 5 area thrifts stores and a processing center.
