This report, commissioned by the Heart of Florida United Way (HFUW) shows that more than 203,000 households in the tri-county area are unable to consistently afford Florida's cost of living. The data includes housing costs, transportation, childcare, and more. Blasewitz added that the data shows the federal poverty line is not an accurate description of the true scope of need.
