• Issue: Educating our Citizens

Summary: Keeping our listeners informed of political and civic issues is a need of our community, and we have dedicated programming time to address this need.

• Crosstalk, "Protectors of the Planet OR Destroyers of Humanity?"

Summary: Ever notice how it doesn't seem to matter if we're having a deep freeze or hot temperatures, much rain or a lack of it, whether there's much snow or little, if the Great Lakes are at a high or low level, nearly everything's being blamed on climate change. So as it turns out, people behind such efforts may not be the protectors of the planet they claim to be but instead appear to be destroyers of humanity. Joining Jim to back up that claim was Tom DeWeese. Tom is the president of American Policy Center. Al Gore had warned of a wrenching transformation society. Tom believes those behind global climate change have figured out a way to get people to voluntarily give up their liberties through fear of environmental Armageddon. Another threat is "commonism." This is the idea that we should have common borders, no more sovereign nations, a global currency, and no private property. In other words, we're all in this together. Is the media being paid to promote global climate change? What's behind the Global Education Initiative? How can people get engaged in this battle at the local level? o Crosstalk, "J6 Footage Provides Another Narrative"

Summary: For over two years Americans have been told by the news media and politicians that there was an attempt by armed insurrectionists to overthrow our government and that it was prodded by then President Donald Trump. However, House Speaker Kevin McCarthy released thousands of hours of footage to Tucker Carlson of Fox News who indicated that the footage aired had been vetted by Capitol Hill police before broadcasting it to ensure that there was not any security concerns. What he's revealed presents a very different narrative concerning what took place on January 6th. To help listeners better understand how this new information clarifies events from that day, Crosstalk welcomed Steven Bonta. Steven is the executive senior editor and longtime contributor to The New American magazine. Was what took place that January 6th really an insurrection? Steven began by describing an incident that occurred in Bogota, Colombia, in the 1980's. Heavily armed communist guerrillas seized control of the supreme court building and the situation ended in a violent shootout with the military and hundreds killed. In comparison, what took place at our Capitol was a mass demonstration where a few "hooligans" got carried away. The people had a right to be there as permits had been obtained and as he noted, "Generally insurrectionists don't secure permits for their actions either." Jim had Steven comment on numerous aspects of this issue. Crosstalk listeners added their viewpoints to the conversation.

o The Phyllis Schlafly Report, "The Problem with Ballot Measures"

The recent midterm elections offer a masterclass for conservative strategists who know how to interpret the outcomes. Three Midwestern states rejected ballot initiatives to legalize recreational marijuana, despite tens of millions spent to fool the public about this issue. North Dakota, Arkansas, and South Dakota all rejected legalizing cannabis. It should be noted that these states have more election integrity than most liberal states do. But in Michigan where voter manipulation is rampant due to a 2018 ballot initiative, a horrendous abortion bill was allowed to pass. Ballotpedia reports that more than a billion dollars were spent on ballot initiatives in this recent election cycle, including nearly \$46 million to enact the pro-abortion law in Michigan. When you are choosing who to vote for among candidates, all you see on the ballot is the name and party. It's up to the candidates to frame what those names represent. However, when you vote for a ballot measure, the writers of the summaries that appear on the ballot have a tremendous amount of power. All of that manipulation happens in addition to the vast sums of money that are spent to mount massive advertising campaigns to persuade the public to adopt these measures that would never pass in a conservative state legislature. The Phyllis Schlafly Report, "No Future For Conservatives In Widespread Early Voting" Donald Trump wisely said, "We want people who 'legitimately' won the election to lead our country, not people who had to cheat in order to win!!!" A record number of early ballots were cast in Georgia last November, more than during the pandemic in 2020, plus another 2 million early votes in the runoff. Some conservatives mistakenly think that the record early turnout in Georgia is the way of the future, when the real future for our nation is returning to one Election Day. No wonder Republicans are losing Georgia. Republicans cannot win an election that has "record early voter turnout." They will keep pushing the envelope until the voices of law-abiding adult citizens are silenced for good. If conservatives can't win elections in a representative republic, no other policy position matters. We must take the offensive by demanding strict election integrity in every state. • Crosstalk, "Covid...Shots...Sudden Deaths...What's Going On?"

Summary: Athletes from youth to college age have collapsed or died suddenly. A surfer standing on his board suddenly collapses into the water for no apparent reason. A middle school teacher collapses in front of her class and dies. What's going on here? Is there any connection to COVID-19 or the shots? How long can we expect this to continue? To help provide answers, Crosstalk welcomed back Dr. Elizabeth Lee Vliet. Dr. Vliet is the president and CEO of Truth for Health Foundation, a non-profit public charity. Since February 2020, she's been part of the team of frontline physicians treating COVID early at home. Dr. Vliet believes the sudden deaths have a direct link primarily to the COVID shots. She noted that the toxicity of the shots was known 20 years ago but they went ahead with them anyway. Interestingly, she also pointed out that in the case of these shots, good, safe, manufacturing processes have basically been thrown out the window. When reviewing this Crosstalk you'll hear Dr. Vliet go into detail as she explains how the SARS-CoV-2 virus was engineered to be more lethal in the bio-weapons laboratory and to increase the inflammatory as well as the blood clotting response. When the shots were rolled out, the public wasn't told that transmission prevention hadn't been studied nor were they told of the adverse effects. What we know now is that people who had COVID and have anti-bodies to it are more at risk for exaggerated damage after the COVID shots. She went on to mention how we normally never vaccinate people who've had an illness and recover. For example, we don't vaccinate people who've had measles or mumps and we don't vaccinate in the middle of an infectious illness outbreak. All of these basic medical principles were violated with the COVID shots. So what about the subvariants that we often hear about? Are they actually stronger than previous versions of COVID? Why does President Biden continue to extend the COVID public health emergency when months ago he declared the pandemic over? Why does Dr. Vliet believe we're currently under militarized medical martial law? These and other questions are answered on this edition of Crosstalk.
