• Issue: Building Strong Families

Summary: Family breakdown in our community is an important issue that affects the community in general. Programming that focuses on family relationships and investing in individuals is aired to help counteract the continuing decay of the family unit.

Programs:

o Focus on the Family, "Leading Your Family as a Single Mom"

Pam Farrel (raised by a single mom) and PeggySue Wells (a single mom of seven!) offer guidance to single moms (and dads!) as they navigate life with their children. They examine some of the best decisions a single mom can make—things like choosing to thrive, creating a nurturing home, introducing your child to Jesus, and learning to respond to situations in healthy ways. It's an encouraging conversation for the single parent.

o Focus on the Family, "When Lives Collide: Navigating Remarriage and Stepfamily" In this broadcast, Sabrina Beasley McDonald will help couples and single adults prepare for remarriage and the formation of a stepfamily. She also talks about the unique challenges that couples face in remarriages and stepfamilies face.

Focus on the Family, "Building Strong Father-Son Relationships"

This father and son team describe the problem of disengaged dads — men who may be present physically but not emotionally with their families. The Beckers encourage dads and sons to be "tender lions" who will confront societal ills and yet remain tender and compassionate in their relationships.

Summary: Part of marriage relationship is talking back and forth about what needs are there and how you can be more helpful to each other. Don't put unreasonable expectations on your spouse. Be realistic.

Winning at Home, "Name Game"

Summary: Play the name game with your family by saying a name and having the family give their thoughts of that name. And then tell them that each name mentioned were known for something. People have thoughts about each of the family, too. What would other people say about them? What would you want them to say?

Aired: During news at top of hour, 22 times during quarter, 60 seconds length

Winning at Home, "Moving On"

Summary: Do you hang onto stuff or continue to hash through conversations that should be let go of? Or are you one that can let go and move on? The key is knowing that about yourself. Consider moving on to the benefit of and the good of your marriage.

Aired: During news at top of hour, 18 times during quarter, 60 seconds length

• Issue: The Importance of the Spiritual Life

Summary: Members of our community that have a sincere spiritual life are more likely to be better citizens and more involved in positive activities within our community. Programming that addresses the importance of a spiritual life fills this need within our community.

o KOLU, "The Pastor's Study"

Summary: Live program that emphasizes prayer and the study of God's word.

Aired: Monday through Friday, 9:30 AM, 30 minutes in length

o KOLU, "Riverview Reporter"

Summary: Live program that provides updates of events at Riverview Baptist Church and teaches spiritual lessons

Aired: Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10:00 AM, 30 minutes in length

o Riverview Baptist Church, "The Riverview Baptist Hour"

Summary: Live program that airs spiritual teaching messages from Riverview Baptist Church. **Aired:** Sunday mornings at 10:00 AM, Sunday nights at 5:00 PM and Wednesday nights at 7:00 PM, approximately 75 minutes each.

• Issue: News

Summary: Keeping listeners informed of news affecting their lives is an important issue that affects our programming for our community. News programs address a variety of issues and help our listeners to be informed and better perform their civic duties

Programs:

o SRN News

Summary: News and public affairs programming covering a whole spectrum of national and regional issues, with a special "Christian interest" section

Aired: Top of most hours, 3 to 5 minutes total length, with 2 to 4 minutes of news content.

• Issue: Educating our Citizens

Summary: Keeping our listeners informed of political and civic issues is a need of our community, and we have dedicated programming time to address this need.

Programs:

o Crosstalk, "LGBTQ+ Agenda Continues Its Advancement"

Summary: According to one poll, 28% of Gen-Z adults are identifying as LGBTQ. The result? Women's sports are being decimated and dominated by men who are identifying as women. Politically, additional LGBTQ+ appointments to the federal bench are being made by the Biden administration, while polyamory is on the increase. Crosstalk welcomed Peter LaBarbera back to Crosstalk. Peter is the founder and president of Americans for Truth. The Public Religion Research Institute is the organization making the claim that 28% of Gen-Z adults (ages 18-25) are identifying as LGBTQ. Peter believes this crisis is the result of the "mainstreaming" of perversion toward young people and that this activity expands the list of perversions. Melissa Ohden shares her story of surviving a saline abortion, against all odds, and later founding the Abortion Survivors Network. Both women now inspire and encourage thousands of people to champion life.

- o Crosstalk, "Pre-born Life in the Crosshairs"
 - **Summary:** Rev. Jim Harden is president and CEO of CompassCare Pregnancy Services in New York. Jim pioneered the first measurable and repeatable medical model in the pregnancy center movement, helping hundreds of centers nationwide become more effective at reaching more women and saving more babies from abortion. He's written extensively on medical ethics, executive leadership and pro-life strategy. This broadcast involved some tough-talk, not just about abortion, but the idea of what it really means to be human as it discussed the following: Rev. Harden's clinic was fire-bombed shortly after the Dobbs decision was leaked. What's the

status of those who launched this act of terrorism? Rev. Harden believes we now have two different justice systems in America. He explained what this means for our constitutional rule of law, for the pre-born and those who support life. Kate Cox, the woman who wanted to abort her child due to a genetic abnormality and her appearance at the State of the Union address. The Alabama Supreme Court decision, why in vitro fertilization (IVF) is just as horrific as abortion and why we should never let emotion drive legislation. Has technology outpaced morality to the point where we no longer have a bioethical standard? The abortion pill, how it works, and the involvement of Walgreens and CVS.
