4th Quarter Programming Issues October 2022 – December 2022

WAME uses a variety of programming to cover the issues of concern for the community of Statesville and Iredell County. These programs are aired free of charge as a public service to our community. WAME is also a member of the Greater Statesville Chamber of Commerce and regularly seeks input on issues of local interest. Our station owner sits on various boards of directors, in our community.

WAME airs a weekly, live 30 min. interview program with the City of Statesville Public Information Officer, April Nesbit. On this program, Ms. Nesbit is interviewed by our morning host on the weekly happenings in City government. Ms. Nesbit also invites local community leaders on the show, including the mayor, city council members and members of the city staff to discuss current city matters.

WAME airs a bi-monthly, live, 30 min. interview program with Iredell County's Manager, Beth Mull. This program features the latest information about Iredell County. Guests include department heads and County Commissioners.

WAME airs a live 30 min. program each Friday morning with the Superintendent of Iredell Statesville Schools, Dr. Jeff James. Each program provides the community with information & news from our local school system.

WAME airs a bi-monthly live 30min. interview with Statesville Chamber of Commerce Executive director, Shannon Viera. Each program features local Chamber members who talk about their business and/or special community projects that they have planned.

WAME produces & airs a local 5-minute program called "Iredell Food & Farm Radio". Every weekday morning & afternoon, members from the NC Extension Service talk about programs and news for and about farming in Iredell County.

WAME airs a program titled "Info-Trak". This is a weekly half hour public affairs program that airs Sunday morning. Two to three issues are dealt with weekly. Among the topics typically covered are consumer matters, parenting issues, seniors and retirement, police and crime, women's issues, aging poverty, and minority concerns.

WAME airs many public service announcements for national, regional, and local charities and non-profit organizations.

WAME has ascertained the top five issues of concern to the community of Statesville and Iredell County and addressed these issues in this quarter's public affairs programming.
