KDZA-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **American Diabetes:** Steve spoke of the prevalence of diabetes in our society over 325 million Americans are affected by this disease. He discussed the symptoms, diagnosis, forms of the disease plus treatment and management. He also highlighted an upcoming fundraiser, Tour de Cure featuring a bicycle tour and 5k walk/run.
- **Animals:** Jan told us of the growing population of abandon pets in the area and how the Humane Society is filling the need for care and adoption of these animals. Jan also spoke of the special needs to house and protect livestock during the black forest fire.
- **CDOT Construction:** As construction continues to widen I-25 to three lanes through the northern half of Colorado Springs, we invited Wayne Bitman in to give a progress report. Wayne told us of the ongoing construction, alerted us to possible closures, lane shifts and other potential commuter problems in the months to come.
- **Colorado Springs Fire:** Following the devastation of the Black Forest wild fire which destroyed over 500 homes Amy outlined steps which can be taken by home owners in Colorado Springs & El Paso County to make their home safer. The discussion included types of building materials, vegetation, distance of evergreens from the home, rock vs mulch and construction feature of the home.
- **Domestic Violence:** Tessa offers a Safehouse, Advocacy and Counseling Programs, for women, children and men in abusive potential life threatening domestic situations. Tess also provide numerous outreach, counseling and Education programs for El Paso County. We spoke with Tessa (tm)s spokesperson and a domestic abuse survivor who has used Tessa (tm)s services were in for the interview. They outlined forms of domestic abuse, how to handle situations, when you should get help, and how to get help. We discussed the growing numbers of domestic violence in El Paso County, possible causes and solutions.
- **El Paso County Recycling Plan:** Spoke to Todd about Summer camping programs, Nature Center Expansion, Homestead Ranch reopening and County Fair. Kathy address a number of recycling opportunities for residents including Hazardous Waste, Smoke Detectors and Toilets
- **Emergency Preparedness:** Flash Flooding is a real concern in the Waldo Canyon burn area this Spring and Summer. We spoke about Emergency Preparedness, personal risk, alert systems that are in place, a family evacuation plan and agencies that can help. Following the fires that devastated Black Forest and the new threat of flooding in that area we repeated this information.
- **Flood Mitigation and Contro:** Following devastating flooding in the Waldo Canyon Burn which affected residents in numerous El Paso County communities (tm) killing three

people, Dave and Kathy outlined why the flooding occurred, measures which are being taken to ease the effects of prolonged heavy rain in the area and steps residences should take to remain safe in emergency situations.

- **Health:** Peak Vista is the community Health Service for the uninsured and under insured of El Paso County. Randy spoke of Peak Vista (tm)s expansion, new facilities, expanding services, how to use Peak Vista (tm)s services, who is eligible for services and how to help fund Peak Vistas service to our community.
- **State Fair:** Chris told us about the history of the state fair, steps which were taken to make the fair self-sufficient, the economic impact the fair has on Southern Colorado, guidelines he follows when planning the fair and what we can expect at this year (tm)s fair.
- **Wildfire Prevention:** Following the devastation of the Black Forest wild fire which destroyed over 500 homes Amy outlined steps which can be taken by home owners in Colorado Springs & El Paso County to make their home safer.
