4/16/23 at 11:00-11:30am: How to harness storm water and the concerning 100-year flood assessment. Guest speakers: Brett Sanders, professor of civil and environmental engineering at UC Irvine and Rita Kampalath, the Acting Chief Sustainability Officer for Los Angeles County.

5/14/23 at 11:00-11:30am: Discussing combating homelessness, hiring more city workers and improving safety on the Metro system. Guest speaker: Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass.

5/21/23 at 11:00-11:30am: Whether it's anxiety or depression, one out of every five Americans suffers from some type of mental health issue. In Los Angeles County alone, that's two million people. Guest speaker: Dominique Hamler, Director of nursing and behavioral health at Dignity Health Glendale Memorial Hospital.

5/28/23 at 11:00-11:30am: Discussing the benefits of transitional kindergarten, school safety and how the district is grappling with the surge of AI in classrooms. Guest speaker: LAUSD Superintendent Alberto Carvalho.

6/17/23 at 6:00-6:30pm: Talking with experts about the backlash growing against the LGBTQ+ community, including book bans and anti-trans legislation. Guest speakers included: Mariana Marroquin, Program Manager of the Trans Wellness Center at the Los Angeles LGBT Center and Aydin Olson-Kennedy, a licensed clinical social worker.

KABC-TV aired **6** hours and **55** minutes and **30** seconds of Local Public Service Announcements on a variety of subjects during all different day-parts.
