SECTION A: NEWSCAST OVERVIEW AND QUARTERLY ISSUES ADDRESSED

WFSC airs four local newscasts during its broadcast day, Monday through Friday at 7:06am, 8:10am, 12:30pm, and 5:04pm, following three to ten minutes of world and national news from CBS Radio News. WFSC reports local and area news events and issues on an ongoing basis.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature news stories described below is between 30-seconds and one minute 30 seconds.

Some of the issues covered in these newscasts and programs during the third quarter are as follows:

1-Public Safety

News Treatments: July 1, 6, 13; August 25, 28; September 4, 18, 22, 30;

During the summer months of 2015, as always, public safety issues were very important. We aired various informative stories about safe driving, car seats, and other pertinent safety advice, such as disaster preparedness tips, to our listeners so they could enjoy the summer time with less risk of being hurt.

<u>2-Jobs</u>

News Treatments: July 2, 23, 27, 29; September 3, 14, 22;

We want to do our part in connecting listeners with the latest job information, including labor market conditions. We are hopeful that our newscasts will help those seeking employment, as we provided important information on resources available that can help them in their job search.

3-Disease Prevention

News Treatments: July 2, 8, 13, 21, 27; August 7, 17; September 4, 14, 23;

Reminding our listening audience on the importance of disease prevention and regular health screenings. Some of our newscasts featured relevant information about Ladies and Men's Night Out events in Franklin, which provide critical resources about how to prevent some of the area's most prominent chronic diseases such as heart disease, obesity, and cancer.

4-Poorly Informed Citizens

News Treatments: July 16, 22; August 3; September 11, 28;

While we do live in an information age, there is still very important local info that perhaps would not be disseminated if not for local media outlets. This is information concerning scams, connecting with our police department, and information on local candidates seeking an elected position. Equipping our listeners with this information makes for a more informed and better community.

5-Public Health

News Treatments: July 8, 21; August 4, 13, 27, 31; September 3, 14, 17, 18, 21;

Public health information is a responsibility we have to get out to the listening community. We strove to provide key information on public health issues, such as mosquito-borne illnesses and preparedness for the upcoming flu season during the summer months. We are hopeful that our citizens will heed these public health messages and create a healthier, safer community.

6-Those in Need

News Treatments: July 15; August 10, 19, 21; September 10, 16, 30;

While signs of an economic recovery continue, many in Macon County struggle with issues such as food insecurity and homelessness. Our goal was to make the public aware of those in need and connect the community with ways they can help local organizations in their mission to serve the needy and help them get back on their feet. Our mission is two-fold, as we also wanted to inform those who are in need with ways they can get help and other resources.

7-Mental Health

News Treatments: July 28, 31; August 11, 26;

The stigma associated with mental illness is slowly collapsing, and we took every opportunity to promote awareness of mental illness in the local community. Part of this promotion included how state-level decisions are affecting mental health services and the reality of mental illness in Macon County and how it can impact virtually every citizen. Also part of our mission was to inform caregivers and those struggling with mental illness about resources, such as NAMI, that are available to help them.

<u>8-Avian Flu</u>

News Treatments: July 8, 29; August 12; September 24;

State health and agricultural officials have been warning for some time about the potential for an avian flu outbreak this fall/winter in North Carolina. The state also began requiring backyard poultry owners to register their flocks with the state in an effort to organize and expedite information should an outbreak occur. With a growing number of backyard poultry owners in Macon County, we aired the latest alerts and updates from the state and local extension office about taking precautionary measures to prevent the spread of avian flu.
