In addition to the programming listed above, numerous news reports and public service announcements (PSAs) were aired too. At least 20-25 reports or announcements, each 30-, 60-, or 90-seconds in length, were aired every day during Q4. News reports provide information on SUNY Oneonta campus events and other topics of interest to the college and the local region. The PSAs represent local and national charities, health and public safety briefings, environmental topics, animal rights issues, and more. These news reports and PSAs have not been listed individually in the above chart, however all combined they amount to a significant body of issues-based programming.

WONY is a noncommercial educational station operated from the SUNY Oneonta campus. The college campus was closed for in-person instruction during a fall break from October 1-October 4, Thanksgiving break from November 23-November 27, and winter break starting December 21 until the end of Q4 2022. WONY broadcast minimal issues-based programming during these periods due to students not being on campus.
