June 25

- 8:15 am – Health Issues. Guests this morning includes Kenneth Lowry and Kristin Patten from Valdosta Ga. They work as a part of the South Health District Public Health Department to discuss updates on COVID-19 vaccinations in the 10 county region that includes Tift County. Kristen and Kenneth discussed the development of the COVID-19 vaccine and how it is extremely safe for the public. They stated that more people in Georgia need to get the vaccine in order for business, church and social activities to be safe. They discussed the mask mandate being lifted in many areas, but more people need to be vaccinated to reach herd immunity. At this time, Georgia is only 37% vaccinated. Georgia Governor Brian Kemp signed an executive order on June 22 stating that the public health state of emergency will end on July 1, 2021. Kristin and Kenneth recorded COVID 19 PSA's to be run on WTIF.

June 30

- 8:00 am - Health Issues. Guests this morning are Liza Tillman and Randy Chambers from Tift Regional Medical Center, Southwell Health to discuss ongoing issues with COVID-19 vaccinations. Liza and Randy talked about the progress from one year ago when the Coronavirus became the biggest threat to American life. Since then, vaccinations have been released to the public and life is returning to normal. The biggest threat was to the elderly, and Randy talked about his role in administering the vaccine in Tift and Cook counties. Southwell has administered over 21 thousand doses of the vaccine. Tift County currently has a fully vaccinated rate of 28.4% and Cook County rate is 27.8%. The vaccine is currently being administered at the WorkSmart Clinic on Union Road on Thursday and Friday. As families prepare to go back to school, Affinity Pediatrics is offering the vaccine for children age 12 and up by appointment.
