“THE JAZZ TEACHER” -- They say there are no more heroes to inspire the young, but Connie Chung found one working in our nation’s capital. He’s demanding and tough – an expert in his field. He expects total effort and exceptional sacrifice from his youthful followers – and they, in turn, dedicate their loyalty. His name is Davey Yarborough, and he hopes to preserve and develop jazz culture and train new musicians. **JAZZ TEACHER** (Producer – Paul & Holly Fine; AP – Julie Doriofine)

"WORRY ABOUT YOUR WIRELESS" -- Brian Ross reports on cell phones and the possibility that they leak radiation into your brain. No blind person has ever had his sight restored. But new technology may make that miracle possible.

Monday, December 20, 1999

"KILLER ENABLED" -- "I have accomplished a lot in my life," says admitted killer Walter Waldhauser. But as ABC News' Tom Jarriel reports on "20/20," many of Mr. Waldhauser's "accomplishments" are due to a series of errors by authorities that allowed him to get away with murder, and an oversight that meant he would serve just a fraction of a prison sentence in another murder. In her first network television interview, Maria Cole, widow of Nat, reveals details of a sometimes troubled marriage and why she never considered divorce.

"JOCKEYS" -- In a sport known for glamour, wealth and power, Elizabeth Vargas reports on how some jockeys will do almost anything to make weight requirements, from taking diuretics to bingeing and purging.

Friday, December 24, 1999

"COURAGE & TRIUMPH" -- Meet Ronan Tynan, an Irish world champion athlete, equestrian, medical doctor, internationally acclaimed tenor -- and double amputee. Bob Brown speaks with this man who overcame insurmountable odds to follow his dreams and achieve a lifetime of success, despite disability.

"DOOR-TO-DOOR" -- Bob Brown profiles the remarkable Bill Porter of Portland, Oregon, one of the last remaining door-to-door salesmen, who despite being afflicted with cerebral palsy, has walked his route for more than 35 years.

"ADOPT-A-NUN" -- ABC's 20/20 takes a look at the Salesian Sisters of St. Bosco in North Haledon, NJ. They have developed an ingenious fundraising program; when they needed money to build a new convent, they matched their community's needs and their special talents to conceive "Adopt-A-Sister."

"TO TELL THE TRUTH" -- ABC's Peggy Wehmeyer speaks to a man, both husband and father, who says he is willing to sacrifice everything to save his soul. Daniel Crockers says his faith compelled him to confess to a brutal crime he'd committed nearly 20 years ago and had gotten away with.

"CAR DONATIONS" -- ABC News Correspondent Arnold Diaz investigates car donation charity programs. Authorities say some are taking unsuspecting donors for a ride in a variety of ways -- some by pocketing or misusing donations, and others by giving little, or even nothing, to any charitable cause.

"SOLITARY CONFINEMENT" -- ABC News Correspondent Chris Wallace reports on debate over solitary confinement of repeatedly violent prisoners. Ms. McGill says she was driven by a compulsion and that nothing could stop her urge to steal, not even her common-law husband, who was a cop and looked the other way. Was it a compulsion or crime?

"SECOND CHANCE" -- Jay Schadler reports on how some suicide survivors struggle to put their lives back together. They are the lucky ones, or at least that's how it should seem. They survived the awful decision to commit suicide and were given a second chance at life. He speaks with two suicide survivors about what it is like to wake up alive after attempting suicide and how they managed to put their lives back together.
