The license of station 89.1 WXVU has determined that the following issues were of importance to the Villanova community during the past three months and has aired the following programs to address these issues:

Don't Sleep on Sleep (Health)

July 13, 2023 60 Minutes 10:00 AM

Don't Sleep on Sleep is a program created by Senior Villanova Nursing students, Tim Jacoboski, Jasmine Huang and Kenneth Tan. They hope to spread awareness on consequences of sleep deprivation and promote healthy sleeping habits in college students. In this Podcast, they interviewed their friend Josh Tsai, a senior at Villanova, about his sleeping routine and his relationship with sleep. Afterwards, Stacy Andes, Director of the Office of Health Promotion at Villanova, provided statistics on hours of sleep students get at Villanova, Tips and Tricks on how to better one's sleep routine and resources students can use on campus. Lastly, Dr. Elizabeth Dowdell provided research on the effects of College Students Sleeping with Technology. In addition to those interviewed, they have also gathered data from a Cross Sectional Study on Sleep Quality and Quantity among US Medical Students and information on the correlation between sleep and health from the Center for Disease Control.

Stop The Stigma: Non-Traditional Students (Education)

Planet Philadelphia (Environment)

Two big environmental issues have had some legal actions recently. There is possible progress towards environmentally friendly solutions in both.

- **John Dernbach** is an internationally recognized authority on sustainable development, climate change, and environmental law, as well as Emeritus Professor of Environmental Law and Sustainability at Widener University Commonwealth Law School. He talks about the implications of a recent decision in the court case Held v. Montana. A court allowed young people to bring their climate change suit against Montana. This decision may affect law suits in Pennsylvania and elsewhere.
- Tracy Carluccio is the Deputy Director of the Delaware Riverkeeper Network, an environmental organization that works to protect the Delaware River watershed in all four states it touches (including Pennsylvania). She discusses the tentative settlement between

the company 3M and the suing affected communities. 3M is to pay \$10.3 to \$12.5 billion to help the suing states/communities clean PFAS from their drinking water.

WXVU Conversation: Kaleigh Brendle (Advocacy)

September 23, 2023 60 Minutes 10:00 AM

WXVU Music Director Chris Cokinos sat down with Kaleigh Brendle. Kaleigh is a Villanova sophomore, a singer and songwriter who has recorded 70 songs to date, and is also a disability rights activist. Kaleigh talked about how music and singing was such a part of her childhood, how one genre doesn't define her music, and what went into making her EP, Karma. Born with a rare eye disease called Leber Congenital Amaurosis, which left her visually impaired, Brendle found her voice as an advocate at an early age. At 17, she challenged the College Board's decision to replace hard-copy Braille AP exams with a digital format. Her victory was a win for blind and visually impaired high school students across the nation. She also directs Sing for Serenity, an international online choir she founded at age 14 for blind and visually impaired vocalists. Brendle discussed these initiatives and more with Chris.
