Elected in 2010, Keating serves on the foreign affairs and homeland security committees. Born in Norwood, Keating attended Boston College where he received his B.A. and Masters in Business Administration. To put himself through college and his graduate program, he worked as a letter carrier for the United States Postal Service. In 1977, at the age of 23, Bill was elected to the Massachusetts House of Representatives. While serving in the State House, he entered Suffolk University Law School and became a member of the state bar in 1985. The same year, he began serving in the Massachusetts State Senate, where he served as Senate Chairman of the Joint Committee on the Judiciary, the Joint Committee on Public Safety, and the Joint Committee on Taxation, respectively. He also served as the Senate Chairman of the standing Committee on Steering and Policy. He was then elected to be Norfolk District Attorney, a position he held from 1999 until his election to Congress.

Podcast: Alliegro (9:54)

Podcast Description: We meet Republican congressional candidate Mark Alliegro of Falmouth, a scientist, researcher and educator. He is a senior scientist at the Marine Biological Laboratory in Woods Hole and a professor of molecular biology, cellular biology and biochemistry at Brown University. He holds a bachelor's of science from Fairleigh Dickinson University, a master's of science in marine science from the University of Maryland, and a Ph.D. in anatomy and cell biology from SUNY, Buffalo. He has worked as program director of molecular and cellular biosciences at National Science Foundation and as instructor of medical histology at Harvard Medical School. He was a member of the New Orleans Public School Partnership for Education, was named Louisiana School Volunteer of the Year in 2000, volunteered at Hospice Care of Louisiana, and is currently a Falmouth Town Meeting Member.

Podcast: John Chapman (10:37)

**Description:** We meet Republican attorney John Chapman of Brookline and Chatham, who, according to biographical information he provided, has worked the Reagan White House, where he served as an aide in the Counsel's Office, and in Massachusetts state government, where he was an agency commissioner and undersecretary of economic development. He worked his way through college, graduating with a B.A. in political science from Kenyon College and a J.D. from Suffolk University Law School.

Podcast: Cogliano (9:29)

**Description:** We interview Republican businessman Vincent Cogliano Jr. of Pembroke. According to biographical information he provided, Cogliano lives on the family farm with his 98-year old father where they grow and sell Christmas trees. He served in the US Army for three years and then attended Bloomfield College on the Gl bill. His business career has seen him work as a radio and television broadcaster as well as a corporate trainer teaching management classes at a major corporation. He served as a Pembroke selectman from 1996 – 2002. He has been Chairman of the Plymouth County GOP for more than six years.

**Description:** We interview Republican attorney Dan Shores of Sandwich, a Republican candidate running for Congress. According to Shores's biography he provided, he grew up in Carver. His father operated a logging company and Shores' early jobs were weeding cranberry bogs and working as a logger. He went on to study engineering, direct capital campaigns, and study law, which he financed himself. He is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire and Georgetown University Law Center.
