

Some questions have been raised recently by city and county officials about the cost and benefits of belonging to Planning & Development District 3, based in Yankton. Regional planning districts were set up by the legislature in the early 1970s to consult with local governments. Greg Henderson, Director of Planning & Development District Three appeared before the Yankton City Commission last (Monday) night.....(NEWS6)(capacities)(:14)

In their documentation, the district reports that they have helped their member governments get over two hundred fifty million dollars in outside funding since 1973.

Henderson used a data center in Yankton as an example of how the district does its work.....(NEWS7)(time)(:23)

Nickles says it's good to have a shovel, rake or garden hose on hand and to watch for areas that have been mowed and have grass lying down as that tends to be drier and more susceptible to fire. He says use common sense when setting off fireworks.

News 6 Nickles Fwkss q. can step on the hot sparklers...:29 Seconds

Nickles says to be careful around trees or roofs as bottle rockets can become a problem and sometimes get lodged up there.


The Yankton City Commission approved sales tax incentives to help spur development of lots located on Highway 81 adjacent to Menards.



A team from the South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks Department has spent much of the last five years on the river below Gavins Point Dam, looking for signs that the fish is naturally reproducing in the river.

Sam Stukel says they have not seen any positive results yet.....(NEWS16)(question)(:29)

Stukel says even if the fish below the dam are successful in spawning, the proof will be found far down river.....(NEWS17)(happen)(:26)

Stukel says working with the biology of the palid sturgeon takes time and patience.....(NEWS18)(times)(:18)

The palid sturgeon is an endangered species, since dams were built on the Missouri River, which changed the natural habitat of the fish.

This could be a big year for Asian carp in South Dakota rivers, and that could be bad news for boaters and fishermen.

Sam Stukel with the Game, Fish and Parks Department (based in Yankton) has been tracking movements of the fish the past few years.....(NEWS6)(spawning)(:27)

Those carp, also known as silver carp can grow very large, and have a tendency to jump out of the water when they hear boat motors, in some cases injuring those in the boats.

Stukel says if those fish spawn, next year would be even worse.....(NEWS7)(closely)(:11)

Stukel says some of the good news is that the fish have not spread beyond Gavins Point Dam on the Missouri River.....(NEWS8)(happy)(:14)

The fish have spread up the James, Vermillion and Big Sioux Rivers.

The out flows of Gavins Point Dam on the Missouri River near Yankton have increased to over thirty two thousand cubic feet per second. That's up from the early summer flows of around twenty thousand cubic feet per second.


Gavins Point Operations Manager Dave Becker says it's getting dry downstream.....(NEWS11)(flows)(:23)

Becker says they are using the spillway because they can't max out the power plant right now.....(NEWS12)(second)(:28)

Becker says they expect the higher flows to continue for some time.....(NEWS13)(again)(:25)

The Corps of Engineers has also increased flows from the other dams above Gavins Point to keep the water flowing downstream.

The Corps of Engineers will take another look at the spillway at Gavins Point Dam on the Missouri River this fall in hopes of fixing the rest of the damage from the massive floods of the summer of 2011.

Dave Becker, Operations Manager at Gavins Point, says when dam releases go down, workers will be back on the spillway.....(NEWS11)(drains):(35)

Becker says as part of this project, they got a large amount of rubble removed from the river just below the dam.....(NEWS12)(finished):(21)

Becker says since the dam had never handled the amount of releases before the flood, they had not seen this type of damage before.....(NEWS13)(agencies):(24)

The dam released flows of up to one hundred sixty five thousand cubic feet per second for several weeks in the summer of 2011.
